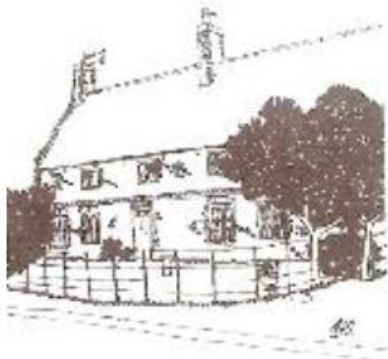

NOTES FROM THE EDITOR

There's been talk in the news recently about whether Shakespeare is relevant and whether the study of Shakespeare should be abolished in our schools. To that I say, "Absolutely not!" but then I am biased, as a great deal of my time is spent in helping young people to understand Shakespeare. For many teenagers, studying Shakespeare is a form of torture (figuratively speaking), whereas for others it's a joy. Yet where would we be without the richness of the words and phrases Shakespeare has contributed to the English language? There are about 1700 of these still in use today, including one which I discovered only the other day: **kissing!** Even Shakespeare's sternest critic will admit that a world without that word would be a duller place.

As I was thinking of what to write for this month's notes, St George's Day and Shakespeare's birthday came to mind, as they fall together on 23rd April. One was a noble knight who became our patron saint and the other was possibly the greatest English export and tourist attraction of all time – his works being translated into more than a hundred languages and his birthplace a "must" destination for millions of enthusiastic tourists. So what of poor St George? St Patrick, St David and even St Andrew have a more public profile. Reading the story for St George's Day in my father's bedtime story book, I was a little surprised to read that "many people wear a rose on the twenty-third of April" because that has not happened in my living memory, even though the red rose is the iconic symbol of England. The same bedtime story ends with these words: "He was a good and a brave man, and worth remembering – don't you agree?" And to that I say, "Absolutely!"

WINTHORPE GARDEN CLUB

I thought that 'Easy Gardening for Tired Joints', the title of Doug Stuart's talk, would involve raised beds and the like. I was wrong. This was about sustainable gardening, which just happens to be the title of his recent book. Doug places great emphasis on the issue of having the right plant in the right place i.e. the plant's requirements being met by the environment in which it grows.

He suggested that, since the 1970s, gardening priorities have changed. Instead of plants in regimented rows, widely spaced, more gardeners now appreciate that planting close together so that no bare soil shows, helps to act as a mulch, keeping in moisture and suppressing weeds, resulting in less work. Not everyone would agree with his next suggestion that our carefully striped lawns should be replaced by a more relaxed approach, mowing less frequently and less short to allow wild flowers and weeds to grow.

A regime of no fertiliser application was trialled at RHS Wisley. Apple trees which had no fertiliser produced as much fruit but without as much top growth, therefore requiring less pruning. Another work saving tip said to be beneficial to soil and plants was to leave trimmings on the soil when cutting back in spring.

Much of the sustainable ethos is to the benefit of insects and birds. The case of greenfly on roses was chosen. Rather than use pesticides, it was said to be better to leave them for ladybirds and bluetits, only resorting to spraying, non-chemical, if the rose was smothered.

One incredible scenario we were asked to answer was the number of miles a Ford Fiesta would have to travel in order to equal the emissions from a 16" petrol mower in an hour. The surprising answer was 90.

An altogether informative, thought provoking and entertaining presentation.

Winthorpe with Langford Parish Council



Last month's Parish Council meeting, held on 21st March, covered a range of topics from around Winthorpe and Langford. Not everything can be covered in this article but for all information on what was discussed, please look at the Parish Council section of the village website, where notes from each meeting are usually posted a couple of weeks or so after the meeting.

You can, of course, keep up to date with what's going on in your village by accessing one or all of our Social Media outlets, which we detailed in Focal Point in March.

Following the recent resignation of a former Parish Councillor, we are now able to announce that, having advertised the role over the last couple of months, we have now filled the post. Wendy Banks from Langford Moor is now a parish councillor and member of the team. Wendy was welcomed at the latest meeting, and we will be working with her to help her to become involved in Parish Council work.

Late February saw the great success of the two days of tree planting on Jubilee Field, involving well over 40 residents, who played their part over both days. We have now moved onto the Coronation Bank renovation work. On Saturday 23rd March a small but enthusiastic group of residents got together to start work on this project. So far, we have planted a number of trees; cleared the steps down into the bank behind the Community Centre; removed broken branches, weeds and carried out some general tidying of the site, so that we can begin to see clearly what work needs to be done.



Once this work is complete (and the site is drier), we will move onto the construction of the raised walkway into the site, from the small bridge over The Fleet on Jubilee Walk. The development of the site will also include enhancements to the access steps, planting of low-level shrubs and, later in the year, bulbs and wild flowers. The overall intention is to provide safe access for residents, whilst preserving the 'wild' nature of the bank, thereby providing a vastly improved area for people and wildlife

to share and thrive together.

As mentioned in previous editions of Focal Point, in April we will begin plans to enhance the old Skate Park area by re-painting the metalwork on the shelter, basketball hoop and fencing. By late spring we will also have picnic benches installed on Jubilee Field, close to this area, to provide all residents with somewhere to rest while going for a walk, taking their dogs out or perhaps for a proper family picnic.

Thanks to considerable effort from Councillor Leane Cutts, we have been granted £7,500 from a fund supported by Tarmac. This, together with funding from Thomas Brewer and some additional local fund raising, will enable us to install a new and additional toddlers' play slide in the children's play area near the Community Centre



As you can see, there is plenty of opportunity in the weeks and months ahead to get involved in these important community projects; so, if you would like to play a part, contact me on the e-mail below or get in touch with Miles Harriman to let us know how you would like to help.

You will see in this edition of Focal Point that we have included a leaflet, covering a consultation on proposals within our Neighbourhood Plan for a new designated 'Village Envelope', which did not exist previously. It would be really helpful if you could please take the time to look through the map and boundary and make any comments via the means identified on the leaflet. The Neighbourhood Plan overall is now out to general consultation, and we will be working with N&SDC, once this is complete, to take the plan to the final stages before publishing it later in 2024.

Just one planning item this month, for some relatively minor repair work to a listed property in Langford. Following discussions within the Parish Council, we agreed that we had no objections and also felt that this was important for the future health of the property.

The next meeting of The Parish Council will take place in the Village Hall on Thursday 18th April 2024 starting at 7.30pm; in the meantime, should you have any questions, comments or suggestions, please contact me: paul@bridgfordss.co.uk
