Revd. Mandy Cartwright

It was due to Mandy becoming our vicar that I became more involved with the church at Winthorpe. At one of our PCC meetings Mandy suggested that Winthorpe really should have a Churchwarden now – and so it came to pass.

Having worked with Mandy for seven years, I have found her to be a most supportive vicar to Winthorpe church. Although she came only once a month for Holy Communion and every other month for Evening Prayer, she was here so much more than that. Far more people in the village know Mandy than those who regularly attend church, mainly because sadly, she took so many funerals in the village and I know how her caring and compassionate manner was a real comfort to many of the families of the deceased.

Every church event that took place, whether as a fundraiser or as a social activity, was supported by Mandy and Phil; and not only church associated events, but also many village activities, such as the Village Lunch, which was regularly attended.

Of course, these seven years here were not straightforward: Covid changed many lives and of course the life of the church. Mandy quickly found her role changing to one of a presenter/performer in videoed church services sent via YouTube throughout the East Trent Group, with Phil acting as Cameraman and producer! Zoom PCC Meetings became the norm; Mandy also developed the zoom Evening Prayer service, which is still being held today.

Whilst having eleven churches in the Group must have been quite daunting for Mandy at the start of her tenure, she soon familiarised herself with all the villages and PCCs within them. Mandy started to bring the Group together more for regular discussions on subjects such as Leading Worship and I feel the Group became stronger with all this regular contact. Mandy certainly leaves the East Trent Group in a much stronger state than when she arrived and we are in a much better position now to face the Interregnum and be able to work through it together.

We thank Mandy for all she has done for our church and village and hope both Mandy and Phil enjoy their new home and more time to spend together, doing all the things they just haven't had time to do. We shall miss them both very much but thank them for enriching all of our lives in the ETG.

WINTHORPE HISTORY GROUP

In our 2023 meetings we were kept busy discussing a wide range of topics, including the school, house histories and deeds, the Gilstrap and Seymour families of Winthorpe, and the Christmas Meat Market in Newark. We had a guided tour of the church in the autumn, and for Remembrance Day we looked at the histories of the people who fought and died in the world wars. Further research on this subject resulted in the discovery of a number of letters sent between about 1910 and 1955, giving a glimpse of life in Winthorpe over more than four decades.

In 2024, some ideas we'd like to explore include another guided tour of the church, a village walk using the Heritage Trail leaflet, churchyard tales, researching one of the older village houses (would you like to volunteer yours?) and investigating the enclosure map. And we have a new venture! Have you hit a brick wall in researching your family tree? Bring it along to a meeting and we'll see if we can help you.

We meet at Winthorpe Village Hall on the 2^{nd} Friday of every month. Everyone is welcome, there is no membership – just come along. The charge per meeting is £2. Our first meeting this year will be an open session on anything to do with Winthorpe history or family history research:



On Thursday 18^{th} January, the first meeting of the Parish Council for 2024 was held in the Village Hall and was well attended by Parish Councillors.

Firstly, we would like to wish our whole community a Happy New Year. We are looking forward to moving forward with a

lot of projects during the year ahead and will keep you up to date via Focal Point and all our Social Media outlets.

As some of you will already know, we have now fully completed the installation of the new defibrillator on the green space in the middle of Pocklington Crescent. The purchase and installation of this third unit in Winthorpe has been a real community success, supported financially from within and outside the Parish. We would like to express huge thanks especially to Pauline Lockwood – this was her original concept and she helped significantly in making it a reality.

In planning this month, some of you may have noticed that a planning application has been submitted by Lindum Construction, for the building of a commercial development to the south end of the Showground site, on Godfrey Drive. From our community's perspective, the important aspect of this is that, if this development goes ahead, this may include a new site access for the Showground from the A17. Should that occur, the problems we have at Winthorpe Roundabout on certain show days could be significantly reduced, although this could take some time to work through. We have a meeting with the CEO of The Showground planned for the 31st of January and will update you with more information in the next edition of Focal Point.

Over these last couple of years, the Parish Council and Cllr Linda Dales, together with residents from the south end of Gainsborough Road, have been working with National Highways to try and find a solution to the increasing noise pollution problem in this part of the Parish. The issue was made worse a few years ago, when National Highways removed vegetation alongside the A1 around the underpass without consultation; this action reduced the tree cover and subsequently increased the noise impact. National Highways have now agreed to re-plant this area with around 60 new trees. To ensure that we get the best out of the planting for local residents

and the Parish as a whole, we have requested that we are fully involved in the process of the work, which will be undertaken in November of this year.

As you will see from information elsewhere in this month's Focal Point, two tree planting events will take place on Jubilee Meadow on Thursday 15th and Saturday 24th February. We have over 200 trees to plant, together with weed reduction matting, stakes etc, so the more people who volunteer to help, the better. There will be lots of things for everybody to get involved in and the Community Centre will be open for toilets and refreshments. We are hoping to get children from Winthorpe Primary School involved and the overall project will be overseen by specialist staff from the Sherwood Forest Trust. So, if you can spare the time, please join us at Jubilee Meadow from 10am on either day or both days.

Once the planting is complete, we will be maintaining the trees over the next few years, until they become established. We will also be looking towards developing a woodland trail around the meadow and through the established tree canopy between Jubilee Meadow and The Cricket Field. Additionally, we would welcome your ideas on what features to include on the walk, such as nesting boxes/bug hotels etc. So, if you have any ideas for this or would like to get involved, please let me know.

In general maintenance, you will have noticed that a number of pot holes have been filled recently, following conversations with our County Councillor, Debbie Darby, and Nottinghamshire County Council's contractor, VIA. The damaged grit bin on Gainsborough Road near the Village Hall has now been replaced. We have reported the missing road markers near the entry to the village on the A1133, travelling from the Winthorpe Roundabout. We have also installed new litter and dog bins at the bus stop in Langford, and these are now on the emptying register.

The next meeting of The Parish Council will take place in the Village Hall on Thursday 15th February 2024 at 7.30pm. In the meantime, should you have any questions, comments or suggestions, please contact me: paul@bridgfordss.co.uk

Did you Know?

Anyone born on 29^{th} February may be called a 'leapling' and in non-leap years may celebrate their birthday on 28^{th} February or 1^{st} March; legally, in Britain, their birthday is 28^{th} February. Statistically, about one in 1,461 births is a leapling and there are an estimated 4.1 million leaplings worldwide.

Traditionally, 29th February is the only day when a woman can propose to a man. As the day had no legal status, it was deemed reasonable to assume that tradition had no status, so women took advantage of this and proposed to the man they wanted to marry. A law once existed in Scotland forbidding a man to refuse a marriage proposal on this day, punishable by a hefty fine.
