## October Reflection 2017

**Dear Friends,**

I was sitting in the Eurostar waiting room, anticipating a train to take me straight from Paris to St Pancras when I read about the exploded bucket in a shopping bag at Parson's Green underground station. I also found out that while I was getting out of bed that morning, there'd been an attempted knife attack on French soldiers on a Paris street. So there I was, sat in a crowded, security checked room, between two potential danger spots, not wanting to talk about what was happening and wondering if the other waiting passengers were doing the same as me as they gazed at their phones.



It was through social media that I discovered the unfolding story and though I knew there probably weren't many actual facts, I couldn't stop reading.

There was a volatile mixture of praise for the emergency services, offers of cups of tea from addresses close to Parson's Green and angry calls for something finally to be done.



There were also some demands to stop praying, which, not surprisingly, caught my attention. Behind these demands were two things: we need action not prayer and all the prayers that have been prayed in response to all the acts of terror have not worked.

It struck me that this wasn't talking about Christian Prayer as I understand it.



You see, I don't think we have to choose between doing something and praying, indeed prayer often leads to action and Jesus himself was both a man of prayer and of action.

Saying that prayer hasn't worked because we haven't got what we wanted straight away sounds like treating God as if he's a miracle dispensing vending machine. We put in the right prayer, press the button to select the answer we want and out falls instant love, peace, happiness and plenty throughout the world.

Life just isn't like that is it? Prayer isn't like that either. I believe God calls us to work with him and share his life and prayer opens the way to do that, so I do believe we should be praying.



When we pray, we might become part of the answer, so it's likely that we'll get more involved with others and life might get more challenging, not less.

Please don't be put off praying for others, caring for them and taking every opportunity for acts of kindness. If you want space or to pray with others, there are plenty of opportunities in our churches, please get in touch to find out more.

# Tunnelling work under our noses

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Close to Winthorpe is Crankley Point Sewage treatment plant, a place we never go to but often get a whiff of as we drive by on the A46 Newark bypass. In Civil War days Crankley was just behind the siege line being between Winthorpe and the Kelham fields. This is the essential starting place for the



creation of Newark's new main drainage system, the "mother of all sewers" that all the towns drains will feed into. If you follow the local news you will have seen that a massive tunneling machine has been lowered into the ground to begin the boring a tunnel over 3m diameter some 10m below ground level from Crankley across to Lincoln Rd before veering south following the route of Northgate, Castlegate & Millgate before re-emerging near Farndon Rd next January. It was at the end of June when I read an article in the Newark Advertiser about the project which included an invitation to suggest a name for the machine. Within seconds the name "Siege Breaker" came to me maybe because I knew the area, or that Newark now has the National Civil War Centre, I don't know? But the idea of tunnelling into the barricaded town to get behind its defences back in 1646 in order to mount an attack from within captured my imagination. So the name "Siege Breaker" was submitted by email as instructed and then forgotten for some time. When I later read that a smaller but similar machine had been named "Wiggle Blaster" I thought that's it! They prefer the more infantile style of naming, so I can forget my suggestion being used. But to my surprise I received an email on the 4<sup>th</sup> August thanking me for my entry and that they loved the name and it would be using it on the machine. An invitation to the launch on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August was accepted and I duly attended on probably the wettest, windiest, drabbist day of the month but still oddly enjoyable (coffee and a biscuit being the prize!) I was told the Civil War theme would be maintained throughout the project and there will be a bit of a show on the breakthrough next year.

# ALLOTMENTS

By the time you read this, our main growing season will be drawing to an end. This is our seventh “season” since the allotments were established and whilst we have seen (as we always expected), some turnover of plot holders, I am pleased to say that we have never had less than 90% occupancy.



However, during October, we will have 2 plots becoming available (previously rented by a single plot holder). It is within our agreement with the Parish Council that, understandably, we should always give priority to people from within the parish when plots become available for rent. In the event that nobody from the parish takes an available plot, we can rent a plot to anybody from outside the parish.



For this reason, we maintain 2 waiting lists (parish / non-parish). At the time of writing, we have nobody on the waiting list for parish residents.

So, if you are interested in taking on a plot to be able to grow your own vegetables and fruit, please contact me by Sunday 22nd

October at the latest and I will provide you with all the information you require and answer any questions you may have. Don't worry if you consider yourself to be a beginner at this - most of us were when we started and even after 7 years I certainly think I still am!

If no interest is shown by 22nd October, we will only then offer the available plots to non-parish residents.

A few hours a week, a fair bit of enthusiasm and some healthy exercise working your plot can provide a lot of satisfaction and fresh produce for you and your family. Why not give it a go?

The Parish Clerk has received formal notification from the external auditor, Grant Thornton UK LLP that the accounts for 2016/2017 are in order and approved. There were a couple of minor procedural issues raised but nothing that impacted on the financial side of the accounts. A copy of the approval certificate will be placed on the Winthorpe and Langford notice boards.

The Council have been informed that Newark and Sherwood Homes are looking to develop land off The Woodlands where the 6 garages are located adjacent to the Community Centre field. No further details are known at the moment but this could potentially have an impact on access from Gainsborough Road to the Community Centre.

The Council would like to thank all organisations and individuals who supported the event which made it a continued success but special thanks go to Sue Masheder and Tish Applewhite for their hard work in organising the event.

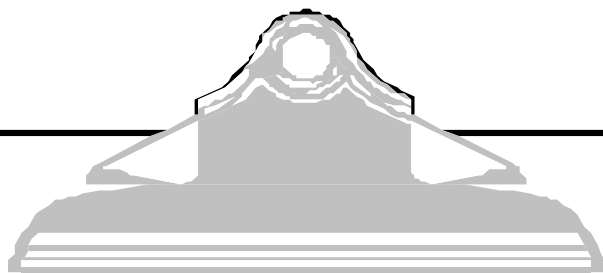
