September Reflection 2018

Dear Friends,

Last month we were all shocked and saddened by the death of our friend Sylvia Lloyd. Her funeral on August 10th was a moving occasion with a very full church and her passing has affected people across our East Trent Group of Churches. She has certainly made a good and lasting difference in our community. I'd like to share with you some of my words from her final service in All Saints.



It was on a cold, dark, damp December evening in 2016 when I first met Sylvia. I'd just arrived here and I was being introduced to Winthorpe Church building. Sylvia didn't need to be there, but she was; she was there to welcome me and introduce herself and to assure me of her support. The last time I saw her was on a scorching hot July evening, at her home, where she was hosting the PCC meeting. I wrote about that meeting in last month's Focal Point.

In both those encounters, and every time in between, I met Sylvia as she really is.

Sylvia never failed to encourage me, through what she said, referring to something I'd said or done. She never failed to let me know how much she loved her family and how proud she was of them and she never failed to let me know how committed she was to church and community life.

She had a strong and clear Christian faith, which was lived out in very practical ways. Frequently she told me how important the power of prayer is and that I should never doubt or stop praying.

Sylvia cared passionately about our group of churches and told me that along with husband Keith she loved to go to services and events in other villages and together they loved singing in the united choir.

Sylvia's death has come suddenly and shockingly, but we can be heartened by knowing that she lived her life to the full right to the end.

We can be encouraged by Sylvia's example to put our faith and trust in God, who through Jesus has opened wide the gates of heaven with the promise of eternal life and reunion with those we love.

WINTHORPE'S INVOLVEMENT IN THE CIVIL WAR



I have always known that a cannon was brought down from York and was stationed in the hill close to Winthorpe churchyard. The bridge described was made up of pontoons joined together to form a means of crossing the River Trent. Pat Finn

Letter from the Earl of Rutland and Lord Montagu concerning the siege of Newark.1646. [HILL 39/3.] 14 March 1646

Contents: Earl of Rutland and Edward Lord Montagu to the Speaker of

the House of Peers; from Lincoln.

"The affaires before Newarke (through Gods blessing) goe on well. Colonel Ledgerds Regiment is come from Yorke to us. The officers and souldiers are all as one man to performe the service they are appointed; full of courage and healthful. Halle the lyne wee hope wilbe finished on Wednesdaie next, and the other wth all possible speed. One of the bridges over Trent against Winthorpe was readie three daies



since. The Trent there divides: the other bridge will be finished in a day or two. Wee have brought a pinnace musket-proofe wthin half a mile of Newarke wherein are twoe Gunns, and wch will hould 40 Musketeers. The whole Cannon from Yorke is come to Winthorpe. One strong fort is made to secure the bridge, Another is prepareing neerer the enemies great Sconce. The whole Culverings and Morter peeces are come to Balderton and Farnton Wee hope in God to loose noe time, nor omitt any opportunity in reduceing Newarke, and to give your Lordshipps a good and speedie accompt thereof.

Post script: The Earle of Dumfermlyn's Regiment of foote is come to Lt. General Leslie"






