NHS App: Have you downloaded the 'NHS App' yet? It has multiple functions: you can book and cancel appointments, order repeat prescriptions, even see your recent consultations since 1st November.

We held a digital hub on the 8th Nov at the practice, which was very useful for patients who were interested in learning how to download and use the NHS App. Keep an eye out for the next date, if this is something you feel you would like help with.

Christmas Information: Details of the surgery opening times over Christmas and New Year are shown on the page facing this article. If you are unwell whilst the practice is closed, please call 111, or 999 in an emergency.

Re-calibration of Blood Pressure Monitors: A big thank you to our Patient Participation Group, not only for funding the re-calibration of patients' home blood pressure monitors, but also for taking time out of their days to ensure monitors were labelled and given back out to patients. It was a huge success, with lots of you bringing along your blood pressure monitors. In total over 110 monitors were re-calibrated, ensuring that your monitors are still working correctly!

NHS 'Friends and Family Test', patient feedback: We welcome all patient feedback; this can be done via the Friend and Family Test feedback slips, available in the witing room area.

Thinking 'Green': We're pleased to share that we now have a 'bra bank' located in the foyer of the Medical Centre, so any bras old or new, please feel free to drop them off for collection.

We're also committed to making more environmentally friendly decisions and are carrying out some green initiatives, such as having a meadow in the grass area of the practice. Donations of wildflower seeds are most welcome!

WINTHORPE GARDEN CLUB

At our meeting on 15th November, we welcomed our guest speaker, Peter Snowden. We had visited his Garden Rooms at Thorney on a damp evening in late June. Now he came to tell us more about the forty years of thought, design and hard work it had taken to achieve.

But before this, he briefly outlined changes in gardening fashion down the centuries from Roman formality, through the open landscapes as practised by Capability Brown, and the influence of Gertrude Jekyll amongst others. Always drawn to the notion of varied compartments or rooms, he described how he had taken inspiration from the layout at Hidcote in particular. He also 'nicked' as he put it, ideas from elsewhere; he cited as one example the oblong pond with surrounding path, which was part of a Chris Beardshaw garden at RHS Chelsea.

When Peter and Jill bought the house in the 1980s, the surrounding land was neglected, with grass, nettles and resident horse. From a blank canvas, aided by their daughters, they set about realising their dream. Peter had always kept chickens so they and a vegetable plot were the first priority. Rooms were formed, gradually working away from the house, by various types of hedging including beech. These rooms contain many unusual plants, some of which are colour themed. A large wildlife pond was created; a building which had once housed pigs was rebuilt as Peter's pottery, incorporating elements of the Arts and Crafts movement as seen elsewhere in the garden. The most recent addition to the garden is an area of woodland, providing a peaceful walk at the extremity of the garden.

Just a reminder, there is no meeting in December but we start the New Year with our annual social event on Wednesday 17th January at 7.30pm. Please remember to bring your food contribution. If in doubt, Julie Parker has the list.

Winthorpe with Langford Parish Council

The meeting of the Parish Council, held in the Village Hall on Thursday 16th November, was attended by District Councillor Linda Dales, in addition to members of the Parish Council.

Good news this Month! We now have confirmation of funding for the Coronation Bank Project behind the Community Centre. We have worked with Severn Trent Water on this and they have now paid the funding we applied for into the Parish Council's account. We also hope to have support from the Thomas Brewer Charity; in addition, the project will be supported by the Parish Council. Some of you may know Miles Harriman, Chair of the Allotment Association; Miles and I will be overseeing the project.

The Coronation Bank Project is, of course, part of other work which we are undertaking on Jubilee Meadow and, to this end, we have established a Project Group to oversee all the work. The group first met on Wednesday 22nd November and an update on the discussions in the group will be included in next month's Focal Point. The group is made up of representatives of all relevant village groups, members of the Parish Council and some interested residents. If anybody would like to get involved in the Project Group, please let me know.

We are looking to start the tree planting on Jubilee Meadow in February 2024 and the re-working of the Coronation Bank will follow in March, so it's hoped to have both projects finished for the Spring for all residents of the Parish to enjoy. Although we are still relatively early in the planning process, we will be looking for people to get involved and lend a hand with digging/planting etc. We anticipate that children from Winthorpe Primary School will get involved with the design of a nature walk, which will include a bug hotel as well as other interesting features. We are also pleased to say that we have secured additional funding to create a 'Community Orchard', which will be made up of approximately ten trees and be integrated into the planting design.

Ahead of possible poor winter weather, the grit bins have been topped up and five bags of grit stored separately at the Village Hall and the Community Centre – let's hope that we don't need to use them!

At the end of November, during Road Safety Week, a project led by Parish Councillor Leane Cutts, covering road safety, speeding, parking etc, was held at Winthorpe Primary School. The children and staff were heavily involved and it included visits from the Police, PCSO's and our County Councillor Debbie Darby. Our hope is that, through the School working with Parents and Governors, this will help to improve road safety in Winthorpe and in particular parking outside the school. We also hope that this may become a model for other schools in the area.

As I'm sure you will all remember, we were subjected to heavy rain at the end of October; on one particular Friday this severely affected our friends in Holme and for several days effectively meant that the village was cut off. In Winthorpe, we also had a situation which could have become a lot worse if not for the support of Parish Councillors. The grid in The Fleet at the side of the Lord Nelson became blocked and, due to the enormous water flow, the river began to rise rapidly. After a couple of phone calls, the Internal Drainage Board attended site within 20 minutes and cleared the blockage. Newark & Sherwood District Council staff also attended site to remove all the rubbish, which was dredged out of the river.

Just a reminder to dog walkers that as it's now out of the Cricket Season, the Cricket Pitch can be used to exercise dogs until the season begins again. We will give ample warning of when this is, in a future Focal Point. Sadly, there have been recent instances of 'poo bags' being left in areas around the parish, including in Holme Parish towards and around Winthorpe Lakes. Thankfully, these have been spotted by responsible dog owners and placed in the red bins provided.

In Planning, only one application had been received since the last edition of Focal Point. This was for the replacement of a communications mast near to the old Friendly Farmer, where there is already a mast in place. Given that it is replacing an existing mast, the Parish Council had no objection. It may even provide better 5G coverage to the Parish than we already have.

The next meeting of The Parish Council will take place in the Village Hall on Thursday 21st December, starting at 7.30pm; in the meantime, if you have any questions, comments or suggestions, please contact me at the following: <u>paul@bridgfordss.co.uk</u>

Langford Lowfields Update 20th November 2023

The reserve is still closed to the public, due to the on-going flooding situation. The public car park and the public footpath that follows the outer perimeter of the site are open but it may well be the case that not all the birds counted on the Wetland Bird Survey are viewable.

At the peak of the flooding, water levels were about 4 metres higher than normal winter levels and the reserve essentially became a colder version of the Mediterranean, with lots of water, a glossy ibis and up to 4 cattle egrets and 10 great white egrets thrown in for good measure.

There is still no firm idea of when the reserve will be re-opened, with the Trent needing to drop a bit more to allow the release of water still sitting on the Visitor Trail. Whilst the reserve remains closed, if you're feeling adventurous the 4 mile walk around the perimeter is worth doing, with recent sightings of great white egrets, cattle egret, pintail, marsh harriers and stonechat along the route.
