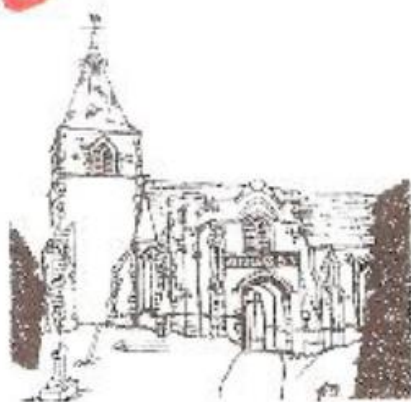
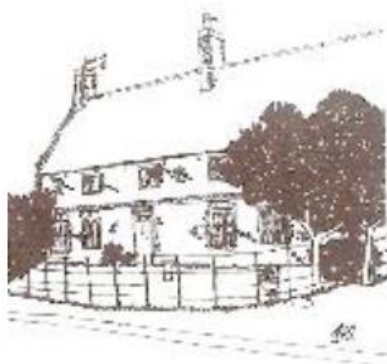

The occasion was somewhat marred by the news that our President's husband, Roger, had sadly passed away. Our thoughts and deepest sympathy go out to Viv and her family at this sad time.

MEETING 11th JANUARY



As the speaker from the New Life Centre in Gambia was unable to attend, due to illness, Ken Heathcote, ably assisted by his black labrador, Piper, gave a talk about the work of Dogs for Good (previously called Dogs for the Disabled).

Ken explained how he came to be disabled. As a young policeman, and very much into his sport, he represented the Police Force at sporting events, before contracting Mau flu, which left him with Kleine Levin Syndrome. Because of the amount of time he had to take off work through sickness, he was

forced to change his career, although still very much into sport and running his son's football team.

Whilst he was cleaning the windows at his home, the ladder unfortunately snapped, and he fell, severing his spinal cord and leaving him virtually paralysed. During the time he spent in hospital, he set himself two goals: firstly to go home; secondly to be able to drive. When he saw an article about Dogs for Good, he applied for an assistance dog, although he was unsure whether or not he met the criteria.

Ken gave a brief history of Dogs for Good before he and Piper demonstrated to us how equipment and Piper help him in his daily life. It was at that point that I believe we all fell in love with Piper.

Dogs for Good rely wholly on public donations and demonstrations, which have been in short supply since the pandemic. Winthorpe with Langford Parish Council

The latest meeting of the Parish Council took place on the Thursday 19th January in the Village Hall; there was a full attendance of councillors, as well as District Councillors Linda Dales and Emma Davies, and two residents.

In addition to the normal business of the council, we discussed works which would need to be undertaken over the next couple of months under the 'Lengthman Scheme'. A shortlist has been agreed and relevant contractors will be undertaking the work over the next few weeks.

We are currently seeking funding for works to be carried out on the 'Village Green', to include: a low-level fence around the perimeter; the removal of the concrete block; a new planter for spring bulbs and bedding plants; and a general tidy up of the area. Hopefully, our grant application will be approved and, as soon as we receive confirmation that this work will be going ahead, we will let you know more.

We have made further progress working with The Sherwood Forest Trust, as mentioned in the last edition of Focal Point. Having visited the Parish twice now, they are currently working on a tree planting scheme, which we hope to share with you in Focal Point's next edition. If all goes to plan, planting will take place this autumn and, over the next few years, will help to enhance our green spaces.

Councillors are having regular (bi-monthly) meetings with the CEO of Newark Showground to discuss various areas of shared concern around the showground site/parish. These include: the impact of the new A46; blocking of the Winthorpe Roundabout during certain showground events; working with Newark & Sherwood District Council to locate a new Bus Stop at the showground entrance; ensuring improvement of vehicular and active travel routes into the site to alleviate access difficulties. If you have any comments or issues you would like us to raise, please contact me at paul@bridgfordss.co.uk and I will ensure they are taken into account.

The Parish Council, together with the WI and the Village Hall, have agreed to trial a 'Warm Spaces' Tuesday Club – please see the 'News Flash' at the end of this article.

There have been limited Planning Applications since the last edition of Focal Point. These include an application for the construction of a large speculative 'shed style' factory unit next to the Curry's/Know How site on the A17, which the Parish Council has objected to.

Neighbourhood Plan Update

The Working Group has not yet met this year, mainly in order to provide sufficient time for as much feedback as possible on the draft plan. It is anticipated that the first meeting of 2023 will now take place in mid-February.

We are currently working with Steve Kemp from Open Plan (our consultants), reviewing the latest version of the Draft Plan. Steve has received feedback from members of the working group, but comments are still being analysed.

Working Group members have reviewed the content of the draft, as it stands, and it's fair to say that we are nearly there in terms of a workable draft plan. Apart from the obvious formatting and spelling errors, there are still some elements of the plan which need the addition of more supporting information and detail.

The two main areas which Open Plan are now working on are: adding in some maps and diagrams where necessary; placing relevant photos throughout the document. This will then transform the plan into something which is attractive to read, as well as having substance.

We are still working to the timescales for delivery of the plan, as mentioned in the December edition of Focal Point, but we will review this at the February meeting of the Working Group and update everybody in the next edition of Focal Point.

The New Tuesday Club will meet in the Village Hall each Tuesday from **2pm until 4pm**. The first meeting will be held on **Tuesday 7th February**, and is supported as a 'Warm Space' initiative

This initiative is supported by the WI, Village Hall, Parish Council and Newark and Sherwood DC. It's hoped that, with your support, this get together will become a firm date in the diary!

FEBRUARY'S REFLECTIONS

Well, there's a time and place for friendly gestures and life would be a bit grim without them, but we all need to commit to something or someone; it might be another person, our career or a hobby. What is your biggest commitment?

Jesus was often surrounded by people and many of them made friendly gestures; some hung around to see what he would do and say, and some enjoyed the benefits of being around him in health, food and good company. Some made the big commitment of following him, putting him at the centre of their lives. That hasn't changed. Jesus lives on and blesses our lives and communities; he still calls us to follow him and make that big commitment. That's the biggest and most important decision I've ever made and I've never regretted it.

If you'd like to think more about what this means, then have a word with me. On May 7th, there is a Confirmation Service in Farndon church at 6pm. In the confirmation service, the individual makes a public commitment to following

Jesus. It is available for anyone who is baptised, although you can be baptised as part of that commitment. We will be running some group sessions to prepare for this and we would love you to be part of that.
