
#### THE LORD NELSON PUB'S CHRISTMAS MARKET

The last meeting of the Parish Council for 2023 was held in the Village Hall on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> December and was well attended by Parish Councillors.

First, an update on the Defibrillator for Pocklington estate. I am pleased to let you know that we have been successful in

securing a grant for £500, sponsored by our District Councillor, Linda Dales. This will enable us to complete the funding of the special installation work for the new defibrillator on the green space off Pocklington Crescent. I must also say a special "thank-you" for the great support provided by Jenny Palmer, Community Development Officer at NSDC, for her help in getting this grant application processed and approved in record time. Thanks Linda and Jenny!

The Coronation Bank and Jubilee Meadow Projects are moving forward strongly; on 22<sup>nd</sup> November we held a Project Task Force meeting of relevant village groups and interested residents, to discuss the way forward and how the projects would be delivered. We have recently secured additional funding for the projects from The Thomas Brewer Charity – a big thank-you to them for supporting this work.

Following a wide discussion of how the projects would be delivered, we agreed that the tree-planting will take place on Jubilee Meadow on Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> February, and that the building of the pathway on Coronation Bank will take place on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2024. On each day, work will start at 10am and finish once we are happy with the progress we have made. Additional dates for work on The Coronation Bank which will be agreed following the completion of the pathway.

So, this is your chance to get involved! We all know that 'many hands make light work' so it would be good to get as many people as possible involved during the work days. Both projects will deliver significant enhancements to our village life, including a new Community Orchard, and the tree planting will deliver benefits for future generations. Whilst we will, of course, need help delivering the physical aspects of the work, everybody can get involved, as we will need to move materials and equipment, digging and weeding has to be done, guidance on planting and design would be welcome, as would of course Tea, Coffee and some food! So please come

along to at least one of the work days and help to improve your village and our environment. If you think you can help, please let me know at the email address below if possible – or just put the dates in your diary and come along to one of the work days. It would be great to have a really good turnout, similar to the daffodil bulb planting that took place on the entrance to the village.

In other news, given the amount of rainfall and flooding in the area, we are maintaining a careful watch on possible risk points and, in particular, the debris etc in the Fleet next to The Lord Nelson. Since it was last cleared out by the Internal Drainage Board, the flow seems to be clear; however, if anybody notices any risk in this area of the village, please either report it to the IDB directly or contact me. We have asked for a small number of sand bags to be delivered, as part of a flood prevention plan. Some of you will remember when this area of the village was flooded in the past; our intention is to ensure that this never happens again.

When we had the recent snow and cold weather, our grit bins and bags came into use; just a reminder that, apart from the yellow grit bins, there are also bags of grit available at both the Village Hall and the Community Centre.

Some of you will know that, towards the end of November, it was National Speed Awareness Week. As mentioned in the last edition of Focal Point, Leane Cutts worked with Winthorpe Primary School, the police and our County Councillor (Debbie Darby) to help the children and their parents understand, amongst other areas of risk, the impacts of speeding in the village and the necessity to park safely on Gainsborough Road. On the few occasions when I have passed the school during pick up/drop off times, I've noticed a small improvement but would welcome your opinion on this, and suggestions of what more we can do to help.

The next meeting of The Parish Council will take place in the Village Hall on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2024 at 7.30pm. In the meantime if you have any questions, comments or suggestions, please contact me: <a href="mailto:paul@bridgfordss.co.uk">paul@bridgfordss.co.uk</a>
