

SUNFLOWER COMPETITION

Time to launch the 2022 Giant Sunflower Competition!

For anyone not familiar with this Winthorpe institution, it is the annual children's competition to see who can grow the tallest sunflower. All children at Winthorpe Primary School can enter, as well as non-pupils (of primary school age) living in Winthorpe, Langford and Holme.



Similar to last year, children will be planting their seeds at school and bringing them home to continue caring for them.

If your children don't attend Winthorpe Primary School (or the potted seeds don't make it home!) you can buy "Giant Sunflower" seeds from a garden centre or shop. Please plant them on as soon as possible to ensure equal growing time, and make a note of the competition closing date – Sunday 4th September –

then e-mail your name and the height of your tallest sunflower before that date to winth-orpesunflower@hotmail.co.uk

As we are hoping to increase participation this year, we have introduced a new prize. We know that everyone will not have the luck or skill to grow a record-breaking giant – but we'd really like as many children as possible to 'have a go'. Mr Cook and the staff

team at the school have agreed to arrange a special treat for the year group with the most entries – so send in your entry, regardless of the height of your sunflower.

And remember that every child who enters is presented with a certificate for taking part, recording their name and the height of their sunflower. Having had two children compete in the competition ourselves, we now have a series of certificates charting the highs (and lows!) of our sunflower growing efforts over the last 9 or 10 years!

Like last year, each child will be given a "Sunflower Growing Guide," with all the information they (or their adults!) need. This means that we won't be writing a monthly Focal Point article, but will definitely report back in September to announce our competition winners.

Winthorpe Garden Club

The Treasurer reiterated the problem of declining income, coupled with increasing costs, though we still have some £1600 in the bank. A recent cause of concern is the introduction of bank charges, with the possibility of other options to be considered.

The Outings Secretary gave some details of two one day outings, which are being organised for this summer. The first, on 15th June, is to Mill Farm Garden, North Lincolnshire, where we will have a picnic; then on to Woodlands Garden near Louth. The second outing, on 20th July, is to RHS Garden Bridgwater, Lancashire. At the moment, precise costs cannot be given, as this will depend on the size of the party, but should be in the region of £45 and £63 respectively. RHS members are entitled to a discount of £8.50. As is our normal practice, we will stop off for an evening meal on the homeward journey. The meal for the June outing will be at The Horseshoe Thurlby where we have been previously.

On Thursday 21st April 2022, the Parish Council held its quarterly finance meeting and its monthly Council meeting in the village hall.

The accounts were discussed at length with its internal auditor, who requested some minor clarification to the accounts. It is hoped that these can be signed off at the next meeting.

The Council discussed the Queen's Jubilee celebrations, which are being organised at the Community Centre on 2nd June 2022. The Council is giving its full support and assistance to the organisers to help make the event a success. The Council would like to thank Denise Day for her efforts in this matter.

The Council discussed the ongoing issue of dog walking around the cricket field. It has been decided to approach one of the nearby land owners to ask if the perimeter of that land can be used for walking.

It was decided to purchase a bench to be placed on the "village green" in front of the Lord Nelson, in commemoration of County Councillor Maureen Dobson, who provided excellent support and assistance to the villages of Winthorpe and Langford throughout her time as a Councillor.

The Parish Council was informed that Steve Lord has decided to step down as a Councillor, with immediate effect. The Council would like to thank Steve for his support over the last 7 years since becoming a Councillor.

The Winthorpe Residents' A46 Consultation Group

After a couple of months of significant progress there are unlikely to be more developments until the statutory consultation process starts with National Highways (NH) later in the year. However, NH have agreed to have regular

communication meetings, which will be set up on a two monthly basis and reported.

Further meetings were held with Newark and Sherwood District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council, the Showground, and our MP, Robert Jenrick. We were able to have the views of the village raised in these sessions. Many thanks for your attendance at the two village meetings, and for your views and opinions; we made sure that these were fully raised.

We understand that noise measurement surveys are being undertaken in locations in the village, particularly in the residential areas likely to be most impacted.

I took three books with me, of different genres, unsure what to expect from my first visit to this former telephone kiosk. I discovered a plentiful supply of books – fiction and non-fiction – to suit a wide range of interests and age groups.

I was surprised to read on the village website that Winthorpe used to have its own telephone exchange, and that the telephone kiosk was still in use until May 2019. Bought from BT for £1, the renovation and conversion to its new role was made possible by a donation from The Charity of Thomas Brewer. Jean Bateson came up with the idea, while Clive Smith and Peter Kingsley carried out the renovation work.

I hope I will be forgiven for having done a little tidying and rearranging of the bookshelves – I must have been a librarian in a former life! In doing so, I came across A Book of Tractors in Ukranian, and paused to wonder how it had come to be there.

With everything that has happened in the world and our everyday lives since The Exchange was created, it makes you realise that History is always in the making, whether it's on our doorstep, in Ukraine, or across the globe. The Exchange, in both its forms of existence, is a fine piece of local history within the community of Winthorpe.

Recipe of the Month: Asparagus Risotto

Saturday **23**rd **April** was not only St George's Day and Shakespeare's birthday, it was also National Asparagus Day. Traditionally, the British asparagus season ends on **21**st **June**, so May is the perfect month in which to cook and enjoy asparagus – and



we are fortunate to have fresh asparagus on our doorstep.

In the month of May, my better half will be looking forward to cooking and enjoying this dish, which I thought I'd share with you (and I'm looking forward to eating without cooking)! (Ed.)

INGREDIENTS				
1 bunch asparagus	175g arborio or carnaroli rice			
1 small onion, finely chopped	800ml vegetable stock			
100ml white wine (optional)	25g butter			
1 tbsp olive oil	25g parmesan, finely grated			

Snap woody ends off asparagus stalks and tip into a saucepan, with the stock. Put on low heat to simmer gently. Meanwhile, cut off asparagus tips, add to stock for 1 minute. Scoop out with slotted spoon and set aside. Finely slice rest of stalks into rounds.

Heat oil and half the butter in a heavy saucepan. Cook onions gently for 5 minutes until soft, stirring often. Add chopped asparagus stalks, cook for 2 minutes more. Add rice, stir continuously for a few minutes, until semi-transparent and making a hissing sound.

Stir in the wine (if using) – it will evaporate almost immediately. Reduce heat to a gentle simmer. Add stock, a ladleful at a time, stirring between each addition until fully absorbed, about 15 minutes.

Test the rice – it should feel just cooked with a slight bite to it. Stir in asparagus tips and last dregs of stock, cook for 1-2 minutes more. Remove from heat and top with remaining butter and most of the parmesan. Season generously, cover, leave for a few minutes to settle. Give the risotto a thorough stir to incorporate the butter and cheese. Serve straight away, sprinkling remaining parmesan over dish.

John Barton of Holme

As early as the 12th century, the area in and around Holme was trading in wool, contributing to Newark's status as an important trading town. A large share of English wool, which was the most sought after in Europe, went to Flanders to be woven into cloth.

Newark wool was exported not only to Flanders but also to Calais, which gained the monopoly on exporting wool to the continent from 1363 to 1558. John Barton, who rebuilt Holme Church, was a merchant of the staple of Calais. He died in 1491 and was buried in the chapel which he had recently erected in Holme.

It is said that the windows of John Barton's house in Holme (believed to have been about a quarter of a mile south-west of the church on the site now occupied by a farmhouse) carried the inscription:

"I thank God, and ever shall, It is the sheepe that payed for all"
