## DID YOU KNOW

1. A stained glass window in the north Aisle of All Saints' Church is dedicated to St. Hugh (1140-1200) Bishop of Lincoln. He rebuilt Lincoln Cathedral after it had been damaged by an earthquake in 1185.
2. In 1874, Mr. G.T. Pierce Duncombe, owner of Winthorpe Hall had erected a church at Brough, two miles from Winthorpe, in the memory of his brother. In 1885 a new church was built at Brough and Mr. Duncombe bought the original building. That same year, it was re-erected in the grounds of Winthorpe Hall. It is now called the Village Hall.
3. The Grove, now occupied by Mrs. M. Thornhill, was built just before the end of the eighteenth century by Roger Pocklington, owner of Winthorpe Hall, as a wedding gift for his son, also called Roger. The house may have been designed by the same architect who finished Winthorpe Hall because they appear similar in style.
4. Chapel Lane was originally called Town Street.

## Langford Lowfields Update



If you have taken the opportunity, since the new year, to walk along the footpath alongside the reserve, you may be wondering what's been going on here at Langford.

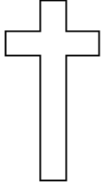
During the run up to Christmas major changes have been implemented to the landscaping; the balancing pond at the top of the reserve (the part the can be seen from the viewing screen) has been re profiled, producing a shallower incline and the edges of the pond reshaped. With the addition of 1100 **Rudd** from the environment agency it should prove to be an ideal wetland habitat, especially for our most elusive resident the **bittern!**

Further into the reserve a massive area has been redesigned for the benefit of wildlife and also to give better access for people once we are up and running. If you are concerned that the reserve is now looking bare of vegetation then you will be reassured to discover that the contractors have relocated the reed rhizomes and our great team of volunteers have been busy planting reed panicles in the areas inaccessible to the diggers, so the reserve will be ready to step into spring with lots of new growth.

Wildlife to spot at this time of year; **blue, great and long tailed tits, chaffinches, a treecreeper and a great spotted woodpecker** have all been seen in the woodland, the scrub by the viewing screen is alive with birds and upwards of 200 **fieldfare** and **redwing**, along with approximately 100 finches, tits and buntings including **greenfinch, chaffinch, bullfinch, blue tit, great tit, reed bunting** and a minimum of 14 **tree sparrows** have been counted.

If you would like to find out more about what is happening at the reserve and what benefits the redesign will have, or you just fancy a walk and a chance to see some **Great British Wildlife** almost on your doorstep, then book onto one our Sunday guided walks. These take place between 2-4pm cost **£2** for adults and **£1** for children and must be booked, please phone **01636 893611** to book your place.

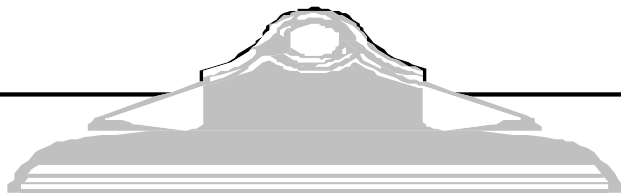
