# GIANT SUNFLOWER COMPETITION

In the language of flowers the tall sunflower means haughtiness. The word haughtiness means proud or superior. The sunflower stands tall and proud with a large bright smiling face looking around and could be saying, 'I am the best of all plants.' I think this sums the sunflower up nicely. Don't you?



Your plant will be nearly 2mtrs high and will have produced a small flower head, as my drawing shows. This usually occurs about 4 months from sowing the seed. Every day the head will grow larger until it is the size of a dinner plate.

When the flower head opens to reveal the yellow flowers an interesting thing occurs. The flower head will turn and face the sun, following it from early morning to late evening. Look out for bees, nature's busiest workers, pollinating the flower. They are attracted by the flower's pollen. The small bees are honey bees and the larger ones are bumble bees. The white tailed bumble bee is our common wild bee.

As the flower head develops, the plant will stop growing and it will divert most of its energy into the flower and seeds. This is a very important time of the plant's life. Now give it a feed of Tomorite every time you water. Tomorite, is a liquid food and high in potash, just what the plant needs. This will encourage the seeds to grow big and fat. As the seeds develop, the sunflower starts to bow its head and will then face the ground. This is due to the weight of the seed head and it is nature's way of keeping the rain off the seeds. Before all this happens and when the flower is fully formed, measure the height

of your plant from the soil level to the highest point.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- The well-known sunflower characteristic of the flowering head tracking the sun's movement is called heliotropism.
- The 'face' of a sunflower plant can contain up to 3,000 tiny flowers or florets. A seed develops from each floret.
- The florets within the sunflower's cluster are arranged in a spiraling pattern. Some spirals go left and others go right. Go and have a closer look at yours and notice the pattern these florets produce.

#### WINTHORPE CRICKET CLUB

Firstly apologies for missing last month's Focal Point I was away on holiday and the deadline fell in the middle of that time hence no report being submitted.

The additional time has also allowed me to give careful thought as to how and what I should include in this month's report. The reason is that this is the report that I had been hoping not to write. As you will have read over recent seasons the Club has been appealing for new players. Unfortunately and somewhat disappointingly those appeals whether via the Focal Point, notices placed in the village, or just in passing conversations, have gone unanswered. The reality has been that in the 7 years or so I have been involved with the Club only 1 new member from within the village has joined and played regularly. Since starting the season we have found it increasingly difficult, despite Simon Potter's best efforts, to raise a team to fulfil our fixtures, on occasion only being able to muster 6 or 7 players! The committee therefore took the painful decision to withdraw Winthorpe Cricket Club from the League for the 2011 season. As well as numbers the Club felt it was unfair to other teams in the league not knowing whether we would honour the game or not and also due to the £50.00 fine imposed by the League for each non-fulfilment of a fixture.

Having got the bad news out of the way the good news is, and I cannot stress this enough, that the Club **has not folded.** The mid week cricket will continue, through the unaffected Kavaliers and Coddington who will continue to use the ground for adult and junior games.

The Committee are and have been working hard in the background to ensure that there will be cricket at Holme Lane for the remainder of 2011 albeit through a limited number of friendly games but more importantly that there will be cricket played there well into the future. Negotiations are currently underway with another local club with a view to merging the two organisations together, pooling resources to create a much stronger base moving forward. The important thing is the continuation of cricket being played in Winthorpe at the current Holme Lane ground. The close season will see a flurry of activity from an administrative point of view preparing for the 2012 season. One significant change will be the switch from the McKinnels League which is Lincoln based back to the Newark Alliance.

The Bonus Ball will continue to run in order to ensure the financial stability of the Club and we hope that we can rely on your continued support on that front. The legendary Bonus Ball jar is back in its rightful place, behind the bar at the Lord Nelson and thank you to Becky for allowing us to continue that tradition. Please take this as a gentle reminder to check your number when you are next in

Unfortunately, like the Village Festival Day, Duck Race Day fell victim to the appalling weather and had to be cancelled. The Committee having reviewed the situation have decided not to try and re-arrange it but put their efforts into organising and expanding next year's event when greater numbers will be available to help.

# Nottinghamshire Police - Vehicle Crime KEEP IT SAFE, KEEP IT HIDDEN, KEEP IT LOCKED.

Following a recent spate of car crime in the local area, we are asking residents to take the following advice. If you have any information with regards to these crimes that are taking place please contact your local police or crime stoppers on **0800 555 111** 

#### Secure your car

Fact! You're more than twice as likely to have your vehicle broken into than stolen. On average, that means paying out £100- just for the repairs.

- Never leave the key in the ignition, not even in a garage when you are paying for petrol.
- Don't leave anything on display (even when you are parked in your driveway). That includes a jacket on the back seat, loose change in the ashtray, a chequebook in the glove compartment or mail with your address on it under the seat. Remember thieves know all the usual hiding places!
- Fit a stereo with a removable front panel (also known as a fascia) and take it with you when you leave the car.
- Never leave car documents or spare keys inside the car. Hide them at home, but not by the door. Thieves will use a hook and cane through the letterbox to steal car keys from hall tables.
- Get a professionally fitted car alarm or a Thatcham-approved electronic immobiliser (you can find an approved installer through the Vehicle Systems installation Board at <a href="www.vsib.co.uk">www.vsib.co.uk</a>), or you can use a steering lock on older cars. You can find information on products that have been tested by Thatcham at <a href="www.thatcham.org">www.thatcham.org</a> (phone 01635 868855) or by Sold Secure at <a href="www.soldsecure.com">www.soldsecure.com</a> (phone 01327 264687).
- Have you cars registration number etched onto all glass surfaces, including the windscreen and headlamps.
- When you're driving, keep doors locked and windows up, especially in slow traffic. Keep bags and mobile phones out of view. A thief can lean in and steal what's on your passenger seat in the time it takes for a red light to turn green.
- If you're leaving your car, put your shopping or anything else in the boot if you can't take it with you.
