

Hello Everyone,

The Easter holidays are rapidly approaching and school is very busy. In the last few weeks both our football and netball teams have been out and about playing matches with other local schools and we are very proud of their performances. They continue to work hard and improve and are reaping the benefits of all the practice they put in and the support they receive from staff and parents. A big "well done" to all of our players.

The school was visited by the Life Education Bus earlier in March and all the children spent some time 'on board' learning about a range of subjects from healthy living; how the brain works, learning about the body, and looking at issues connected with friendships and feelings. It was a great day and our thanks go to the Newark Castle Rotary Club for partially funding the visit. The Rotary Club are also very kindly donating a shed to our school grounds for which we are very grateful – we are a small school and struggle for space so this gift is very much appreciated.

The School's Annual Book Fair has also been held recently. This event is

really important to school. For a week, there was a large selection of books available for children to buy, and for every penny spent by children/parents, the school earned commission on the sales. The money raised



through this scheme is vital in helping us to restock our library and reading resources. I am pleased to tell you that we 'beat' our target this year round and

are delighted that the children will be able to benefit from a new influx of books to further their education and personal interest in reading. Thank you to everyone, parents, grandparents and children who bought a book!

Our Parent and Teacher Association (PTA) is going to be very active over the next few months and there are some events where it would be great if you

would come and support us. On Friday 1st April 2.30-3.20pm there is an Easter Coffee and Cakes Afternoon (including a raffle) in aid of both PTA and the Red Cross funds. The children will also be doing an Easter Egg Hunt in the grounds. On Saturday 21st May there will be a Car Boot Sale on the school grounds – please look out for further details on this – and our



Summer Fete 'The Sizzler' will be held on Friday 1st July. It would be lovely to see you at any of the above events.

The PTA is also putting on a couple of events specifically for the children. The Easter Disco and 'Chocolate Bingo' take place before the Easter holidays, and on Friday 17th June, we are hosting a 'BounceAbout' Event, when the school field will be covered in bouncy castles etc which we think the children will love.

The School Council (which is formed from 2 children from each of our 4 classes) has been working closely with the Red Cross - they are making chocolate crispy cakes to sell at the Easter Disco and have been encouraging parents to fill bags with donations.

Easter time is always 'Sunflower Competition' time in school, and Mr and Mrs Ferreira have been into school to launch this year's competition. Seeds have been sent home with the children and we look forward to hearing about the results in September.

GARDEN CLUB

The title of Stuart Dixon's presentation was "Rustic Charm of England's Cottage Gardens". Stuart travels all over Britain giving talks to garden clubs and horticultural societies and takes the opportunity to visit and photograph gardens he comes across in his travels.

The gardens he highlighted for his talk were mainly in the Cotswolds with the backdrop of honey-coloured stone houses but he also showed slides of the lovely gardens at Blickling Hall in Norfolk.

Gardens in England are unique and very diverse due mainly to our temperate climate. We can grow many plants from other parts of the world e.g. dahlias originate in South America and were brought to Europe because the tubers could be eaten. When the potato arrived dahlias went out of favour as food but their flowers ensured they became garden plants. Roses came



here with the Romans and rudbeckias, helenium and penstemons came from the American Prairies.

We were shown pictures of cottage garden favourites – delphiniums several feet high in blue, purple and pink and roses – both the new David Austin varieties and very old shrub roses. At Snowshill Manor near Broadway there are many varieties of phlox and a garden in Stroud has lots of irises. Blickling Hall has large herbaceous borders filled with many colourful perennials, especially rudbeckias and heleniums.

We all enjoyed Stuart's talk and pictures laced with humour and anecdotes. Stuart Dickson's own garden at Stoke Bardolph is open on Sunday 26th June. Tea, coffee, cakes and scones are available and money raised goes to charities.

Our next meeting is on Wednesday 20th April: AGM and plant sale.

Hopefully everyone has planted their seeds on Easter Sunday

(27th March) and will be eagerly watching for the first tiny shoots to appear. This should happen about 7-10 days after planting. The tiny seedlings will need to be rotated every day as they will lean towards the light. If they're in a sunny spot take care that the soil doesn't dry out! If you're lucky enough to be going away

over the school Easter holidays you will need to find a "babysitter" for your seedlings.....they are very well behaved and should be no trouble!

We can't wait to see the towering giants that you grow from your 10 tiny seeds.....


Winthorpe Summer Festival 2016

(C) This Frith's postcard shows a wider view of the hill. It's a hand tinted photograph and should soon be available for viewing in colour on the Winthorpe website archives.



Did you realise post cards are often referred to as PC's just as personal computers are also known as PC's. (D) Next we have an interior view of **All Saints** post dated 1904. The church (according to Arthur Mee's Nottinghamshire in 1938) "was built half a century ago (1888) on the site of an earlier church. It is constructed of red brick and stone and the spire reaches 105 feet. Worthy of mention is the elaborately carved stone reredos which has figures in the niches."





(D) Text reads: "Talking about Good Friday, don't you think we have had some Good Friday weather today? M.B."

Sent to: Miss A. Scote, Vernon Street, Newark on Trent.

Sent only a short distance! But with similar content that you might put into a text message today, with only the delivery speed being the difference. An interesting thought is that you could have walked the distance there and back well before it was delivered by the postman! A day or two reduced to a couple of seconds!!!! News from Langford Lowfields March 2016

Spring has sprung here at Langford...well it's

definitely springing anyway. On recent sunny days we have had numerous bumblebees on the wing as well as small tortoiseshell and peacock butterflies. The most recent Wetland Bird Survey (WeBS) shows that wildfowl numbers are beginning to dwindle as the ducks head further north to their breeding grounds and the first dunlins of spring have been moving through the reserve.

The cowslips are blooming, the Cetti's warblers are still singing away and are now being joined daily by the melodic dawn chorus of song thrush, blackbird, robin, wren and dunnock. We also have some very vocal, if slightly less tuneful, oystercatchers. The surest sign of spring has to be the chiffchaff, seen but not yet heard by Jenny, the warden. Be sure to listen out on your next visit for its distinctive 'chiff chaff' call.

Over the past month, the Sunday volunteers have helped Jenny to lovingly restore the sand martin bank to its former glory, in readiness for the arrival of the first birds. Following the great success of the bank in former years, last year was full of disappointment



when no sand martins used it. We now have our fingers tightly crossed for this breeding season. Sand martins are already arriving in the south so it shouldn't be too long before they reach the dizzy heights of Langford Lowfields.

We are currently looking for volunteers to join our Beach Hut team, if you have a few hours to spare each week, enjoy meeting people and helping others to engage with nature and can offer a professional but friendly welcome to visitors please get in touch – you may also increase your bittern spotting chances ©



WINTHORPE WITH LANGFORD PARISH COUNCIL

On Thursday 17th March 2016 the Parish Council held its monthly meeting in the village hall.

The Council received an update on the "Outreach Solution" regarding the viability of a "temporary" Post Office in the village. As you may recall, this is



where a local Post Office operator utilises a portable computer and brings cash, stamps etc. for use by the village. It is intended to use the Community Centre for a two hour period on a Thursday morning.

Discussions are well underway and it is hoped that something will be in place in the near future. For this to be viable, it is important that the village make use of this service.

The Council have received numerous complaints regarding the state of hedges, bushes etc. which overhang footpaths and highways within the village. These impact on pedestrians and in some cases vehicles. Wherever possible, the Council would be grateful if the owners concerned could tend to these so they are not a nuisance for the rest of the village.

I am delighted to say that the village has purchased a defibrillator and by the time you read this article, it should be in a secure safe, attached to one of the external walls to the Village Hall. Access to the defibrillator will be via a coded key pad details of which will be supplied to all villagers and the emergency services.


