# News from **Langford Lowfields**

### **Important Information:**

### Floods and rising water levels on the reserve

This month has seen a considerable amount of rainfall and the impact of this is that whilst the river hasn't come over the flood bank yet, Slough Dyke (which follows the southern and western boundaries of the reserve) is backing up and cascading over into Phase 3. We still can't release water into the river (because it's so high) and so levels on site have now got to the point where not only the pond dipping platform and boardwalk are submerged, but all the low spots on the trail around Phase 1 are underwater and have been closed. This means that the only walk now available is from the Beach Hut to the 360 Viewing Platform (aka Corfe Castle) and back again. You can no longer do a loop around Phase 1. To get to Corfe Castle a diversion has been put in place from the Beach Hut to keep people away from the water. Slough Dyke has also flooded large sections of the perimeter that circle the site.

All the non-public areas are also flooded with the various parts of the reserve joining together to form one big body of water. The reed is still sticking out the water though, so keep an eye out for Barry the Bittern clinging valiantly to the top of the tallest reed stem!

# Winthorpe Garden Club

This month the Winthorpe Garden Club was treated to an autumn/ winter wreath-making session, courtesy of Jan Thompson and Susie Connings. Jan and Susie live in Winthorpe and are neighbours; both share a love of flower arranging, and Susie especially has much experience in making Christmas wreaths which can last as long as Valentine's Day!

Jan told us about how she was inspired to develop a cutting garden within an area of her mature garden, to enable her passion for flower arranging. She told us about the successes as well as the odd disaster. She is attempting to develop a continuous flowering display so that she can replenish her stocks, therefore enabling her to have an indoor flower arrangement all the way through to November. She emphasised dahlias, zinnias, white cosmos, scabia and euphorbia as being garden successes.

Jan explained that floristry is increasingly becoming more environmentally friendly. For example, an emphasis on seasonal flowers and using sustainable materials which can be recycled and avoiding materials such as cellophane and oasis. She emphasised how doing a jam jar posy was an incredibly sustainable way of engaging with flower arranging. She also recommended using herbs like rosemary and mint in arrangements.

The Garden Club had great fun constructing their wreaths, building them up from foliage foraged from Jan's garden, and then finishing them off with 'treat' items such as cinnamon sticks and pine cones. This was accompanied by mince pies and mulled wine to get us into the festive mood. Jan and Susie did a super job at helping us along the way, and we are very grateful for the efforts they put into making this such an enjoyable experience. I am sure that the village will be suitably decorated with wreaths for the coming season!
