

The bridge between the Cottage




Lane car park and the reserve entrance needs some repairs and this means that from 1-15 June 2020 the bridge will be closed. At this stage it is unlikely that there will be any access to the reserve for either dog walkers or those visiting the RSPB reserve. Over the past month we have continued to hear the Bittern booming although it has been quiet very recently. Other sightings include:

The work parties have been working in the woodland thinning sycamore and planting field maple, hazel, damson, holly and yew - all of which will diversify the understory of the woodland; prepping the ground to plant woodland seeds, and the great clean up operation post flood has started. The flood water took down a large length of fencing on the northern end which has been cleared away now, and the team are clearing the debris deposited at the containers.

Time to launch the 2020 Giant Sunflower Competition!

For anyone not familiar with this Winthorpe institution, this is the annual children's competition to see who can grow the tallest sunflower. All children at Winthorpe Primary School can enter, as well as non-pupils (of primary school age) living in Winthorpe, Langford and Holme.

Charlie and I will be visiting the school on Friday 27th March to deliver a "sunflower assembly" and give out a packet of seeds to each child. This normally involves a lot of comedy, and hopefully the children leave feeling excited about planting their seeds and "having a go"!



If your children don't attend Winthorpe Primary you can buy "Giant Sunflower" seeds from a garden centre or shop. The children plant their seeds on **Easter Sunday (12th April)** and need to nurture

them through the spring and summer until the competition ends on **Sunday 6**th **September**. We hold a 'prize presentation' assembly shortly after that, where we give out trophies to our winners. With skillful use of ladders, broom handles and blu-tac, we stick paper sunflowers on the wall of the school hall to show the height of our winners – they are always impressively tall!

We would really encourage everyone to have a go -- every child who enters is presented with a certificate for taking part, recording their name and the height of their sunflower. This year we are introducing a new trophy to encourage cparticipation: in addition to the usual prizes for the tallest sunflowers, there will be a trophy for the colour group (the 'house' system used at Winthorpe) with the highest number of entries.

Another change for this year is that, rather than relying on my Focal Point articles, each child will be sent a "Sunflower Growing Guide" with all the information they (or their adults!) need. This means I won't be writing a monthly Focal Point article, but I will definitely report back in September to announce our competition winners.






Winthorpe Community Centre Charity

Recipe found from **BBC Good** Food -Simple Simnel Cake

METHOD: Heat oven to 160C/fan 140C/gas 3. Tip the zest, juice, Cointreau, mixed fruit and cherries into a bowl. Grease a 2kg loaf tin with baking parchment. Shape the marzipan into a sausage the length of the tin, roll out to the width with a rolling pin.

Put the butter, sugar, flour and eggs and milk in a bowl and beat until smooth. Stir in the mixed fruit and their juices. Spoon half the mixture into the loaf tin, then cover with the layer of marzipan. Top with the rest of the cake mixture. Bake for 1 hr 50 mins until risen and firm to the touch.





APRIL 2020 REFLECTIONS





Well this season of commas and full stops is carrying on relentlessly isn't it? When rivers overflowed onto saturated fields, flooding brought real difficulty and anxiety for some of us and delays and detours for us all across East Trent. Overlapping with the inconvenience and threat of flooding came along the anxiety and threat of infection due to the spread of Covid-19 (Coronavirus).

Because of this virus, church services have become creative with inventive ways of "Sharing the peace" without shaking hands and repetitive with the recital of advice on sharing bread and wine at Communion. I'm sure that no one needs any reminders to take care of yourselves, or instructions on hand washing or permission to stay in if you have a raised temperature. The tricky thing with such a lot of advice about how to keep ourselves safe is that we can make the mistake of thinking we're the only ones who matter and when taken to extremes, that's a mistake which can lead to fights over loo rolls.

The Coronavirus brought unexpected delays here because we live in such a small world that when China gets sick, Winthorpe church has to wait for everything to be in place before our new heating system is installed.

That pause or comma will not stop us celebrating Holy Week and Easter, which is the final week of Jesus' life and his resurrection. Easter is the great festival of life over death and love over hate and with shouts of alleluias; we proclaim that Jesus is alive.

Of course, we don't go straight to Easter Day. On Good Friday, we remember Jesus' death by crucifixion, the cruelest full stop to all the good which Jesus did and all the hope he brought. We will have a Good Friday service in the village hall, with time to think about how much God loves us. There will be tea and hot cross buns, so don't miss being there.

Thankfully, that full stop was turned into a comma, a pause, because Jesus

rose to life again. We will celebrate that on Easter Day in the village hall, and we'd love you all to join us.

Do take care of yourselves and your neighbours. Do join in our Good Friday service and Easter celebration and have a very happy and blessed Easter. Revd Mandy.





Work on the boiler replacement has also been affected by Covid -19! Some of the equipment is coming from China and so there will be a delay in that arriving. It is hoped that work might be able to start sometime in April. When it does, this will mean the church will not be able to be 'Open' during that time. Notices will be displayed informing everyone when that actually happens.

As you will see in another part of FP, members of the PCC and the WI have joined together to offer help to anyone in the village who is not able to get out for shopping purposes due to self- isolation or illness. This is just one way we can try to make sure no one is forgotten and all villagers can have contact with someone near to them.

Sadly, with no Services in the church/village hall the 'Flower ladies' will not be needed to put in their beautiful displays for Easter but maybe something could be created at home for a window which can be seen by others? That would really brighten us all up as we (those that are allowed!) move around the village.

All I can now say is that everyone who is ill at home, hospitalised or having to self-isolate is in our thoughts and prayers. Stay safe and keep in contact with each other.
