

I can't believe summer is nearly over! Many of us will be going back to school, work and to somewhat of your normal/ old routines.



Seasonal Flu Vaccination Campaign 2020

We will be holding 3 Saturday morning flu clinics on

Saturday 26 September 2020, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm Saturday 10 October 2020, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm Saturday 31 October 2020, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm

We are aiming to vaccinate 100% of eligible patients this year, as defined by NHS guidelines. We may be able to open our offer beyond those eligible after 31 October 2020 (dependent on stocks/uptake).

Due to COVID social distancing measures, our Saturday clinics will focus on patients who are able to walk and stand unaided for up to 20 minutes. No seating available. Vaccinations will be administered with patients stood up and a strict one-way system through the Practice will be in operation.

Face masks must be worn. Please attend alone, unless a family member is also booked for flu vaccination.

For patients with mobility issues we will be holding weekday flu clinics. Our PCAs will triage at the time of booking.

Housebound patients will be contacted by the practice in due course.

These are appointment only clinics. Appointments will be available to book from August. Please contact the number below or ask at Reception.

UPDATE FROM COLLINGHAM PPG & CMG

A Virtual PPG

The Patient Participation Group (PPG)with Collingham Medical Centre(CMC) had a virtual meeting recently. Due to the Covid-19 situation regular PPG events and activities have been suspended for the rest of the year. However, members are busy keeping the posters on village notice boards up to date and sharing information within the parishes.

The CMC has welcomed some new staff members: Dr Jatin Shar and Dr Anangoor Suresh. CMC continue is a Training Practice and are supporting 2 GP Registrars - Dr Freddie Reynolds and Dr Catherine McGillivray for the next 3-4 months and they will return to CMC for their final year in GP Specialist Training.

The CMC continue to operate a full telephone triage system to support patients and signpost to the right support incl. red, amber or green entrances to the building. We will continue to use the car park and patients' cars for waiting (rather than entering the building) for our amber and red triaged patients. This will continue throughout Winter.

Masks

Patients are asked to wear a mask when entering the CMC. As a clinician needs to support you within 2 meters the clinical team are wearing full PPE for all consultations. The non-clinical staff can maintain 2m distancing (i.e. behind the sneeze screens) and can work in a COVID safe way without masks. All areas are well ventilated and touch points in communal areas cleaned 3 times daily and after every patient in a consultation room.



Flu clinics

In addition to weekday clinics, three Saturday Flu Clinics are being held on 26 September; 10 October and 31 October - 8.15am - 12.30 pm. Due to Covid-19 distancing measures the Saturday clinics will focus on patients who are able to walk and stand for 20 minutes. There will be no seating available. Vaccinations will be administered whilst standing and a strict one-way system will be in operation. Face masks must be worn and please attend alone unless a family member or a 'bubble' member is also booked for a vaccination. Patients with mobility issues will be able to attend a weekday flu clinic. Please telephone to book your flu vaccination and the PCAs will signpost you to the appropriate clinic for your needs. Housebound patients and those in Care Homes will be vaccinated ahead of the flu clinics.

* Please note that people in the 50 to 64-year-old age group will not be vaccinated until November and December, providing there is sufficient vaccine, and no appointments will be offered for this age group until then. This is to ensure that those who are most at risk are vaccinated first. If you are 50 to 64 and you are in one of the other groups which is eligible for the flu vaccination, for example you have a health condition which puts you at risk from flu, you will be invited earlier.

Pharmacy deliveries

Government funding for pharmacy delivery for those who were shielding has come to an end. CMC and Collingham Pharmacy continue delivery for those who are deemed high risk. Collingham Village Care (CVC) continue to collect prescriptions for some patients and will continue to do so if requested by a patient.

Befriending in conjunction with the Newark Live at Home scheme continues with 17 patients being supported. Good news is that a further 4 volunteers came forward from the Collingham Community Conversation virtual meetings. The next PPG meeting is not until December when we will hold the AGM but, in the meantime, we will focus on support for communications to relay key messages for

patients via newsletters, magazine articles and posters.

WINTHORPE WITH LANGFORD PARISH COUNCIL







There is no Parish Council meeting in August but I thought I would update you on current activities within the villages.

Lizzie, the editor of Focal Point, has been working on a new design for the front cover. This has now been decided and should appear on cover of the September edition. Many thanks to all those who have contributed and made suggestions towards the new cover.

The "Winthorpe Library" (Old Telephone Box on Gainsborough Road) is once again stocked with books to borrow and return. If you have any unwanted books, please contact Jane Bateson who is always delighted to refresh the books on offer.

The issue of dog mess has been brought to my attention particularly on the Cricket Club and Jubilee fields. Many thanks to the vast majority of dog owners collect their dog mess and place it in the numerous dog bins around the village.

This is an appeal to those that don't use the dog bins. There can be nothing worse than someone playing cricket or someone using the fields for other activities to find dog mess on their shoes or clothes.

We don't want to get to a position where these fields are closed to all dog owners due to the inconsiderate actions of a very small minority.

The Parish Council are pursuing NSDC and NCC to replace/upgrade the numerous signs around the village that are in a poor state of repair. We are advised that there may be a delay in undertaking these works due to Covid 19 restrictions but it is on the Parish



RSPB Langford Lowfields

- September News 2020











It's been another busy month down at Langford Lowfields and the volunteer teams have had the mammoth task of replacing nearly 100 fence posts along the western side of the site. Some of the fencing was damaged by the flooding and some was old and in need of replacement, but after several weeks of hard work, the whole stretch of fence is now looking much better. The grounds maintenance crew have also been busy cutting back the various footpaths on and around the reserve, keeping the access open for our visitors.

Our next task now we have finished our fencing is reed planting out on Phase 3 (the bit you see to the south from the Seasonal Trail). We grow all our own reed seedlings in our polytunnel and plant them out in late summer inside wire mesh cages. The cages protect the young reed from hungry geese who like nothing more than to munch on fresh reed shoots. We will aim to get at least 10,000 reed seedlings planted this summer.

There has been some brilliant wildlife on site in the last few weeks. The great white egret total has now gone up to 6, a definite reserve record and great to see so many at once. Wader passage has started, with several species seen on site including redshank, spotted redshank, greenshank, green sandpiper, common sandpiper, wood sandpiper, ringed plover, little ringed plover, turnstone, whimbrel, ruff and sanderling. Quite a list. An osprey flew over at the beginning of August, the gull roost has produced Caspian gull, Mediterranean gull and yellow-legged gull and the bittern has been seen regularly, often from the 'Corfe Castle' viewing platform on the Cromwell Trail.

The reserve is now fully open, with the boardwalk and bridge now open on a one-way system. The Beach Hut is open when there is a volunteer on duty, but please remember social distancing if using the Beach Hut. And the Seasonal Trail is now also open from mid-August until November. The Seasonal Trail gives good views over the southern end of the site (often where the best waders are), so it's well worth a look.

SEPTEMBER'S RECIPE: - COURGETTTES -



It's courgette season! Well... It is coming to the end of the season but in no way does that mean we can't experiment with a new recipe.

Growing up in Australia (where they call courgettes "zucchinis") a **ZUCCHINI SLICE** was always at birthday parties, gatherings and sometimes an after-school snack. So whilst there is an over-flow of zucchinis, here is my favourite recipe to you:

We usually substitute the bacon for any veggie e.g: carrot, spinach etc. and add two cloves of minced garlic + mixed herbs and salt

I hope to keep well and virus free and I hope we all have the strength and perseverance to keep on looking out for our friends and neighbours and staying safe ourselves.

Hope is something which is really important isn't it? It is more powerful than wishful thinking when I dream about everything being different and suddenly better and it's more powerful than blind and endlessly cheerful optimism, when I assert that everything will be alright, whatever the circumstances.

Hope is what gets us out of bed in the morning, because it reminds us that there is a new day ahead, full of possibilities as well as reminding us that we've lived through many other days and already overcome lots of problems and difficulties. Hope is what keeps us going even when we can't go out or hug our family and friends and when we have to remember to wear a face mask.

I am convinced that hope is a gift from God and this year, when I've read so many of the psalms in the Bible, I've read a lot about hope



and it means a lot there, because in the psalms, you read about life as it really is, with moments of dreadful despair as well as great happiness. Running through it all, is hope which is based on God's love for us, hope which even death can't destroy.



One of my favourite verses is from psalm 73, verse 26. In fact, I might make it my motto for 2020. This is it:

My health may fail and my spirit may grow weak, but God remains the strength of my heart; he is mine forever. There we have the source and reason for our hope.

Here is one of my favourite prayers, it's a good way to start the day and it is full of hope:

The night has passed, and the day lies open before us;
As we rejoice in the gift of this new day,
So may the light of your presence, O God,
Set our hearts on fire with love for you;
Now and forever. Amen.
