



Have a warm and wonderful August!



MEDICAL CENTRE

Seasonal Flu Vaccination Campaign 2021

We will be holding 2 Saturday morning flu clinics on

Saturday 18 September 2021, from 8.00 am - 12.30 pm Saturday 23 October 2021, from 8.00 am - 12.30 pm

We are aiming to vaccinate 100% of eligible patients this year, as defined by NHS guidelines. We may be able to open our offer beyond those eligible after 31 October 2021 (dependent on stocks/uptake).

Saturday clinics will focus on patients who are able to walk and stand unaided for up to 20 minutes. No seating available. Flu Vaccinations (and possibly 3rd COVID vaccine once details are confirmed) will be administered with patients stood up and a strict one-way system through the Practice will be in operation. We will continue to wear face coverings to protect your healthcare setting.

For patients with mobility issues we will be holding weekday flu clinics. Our PCAs will triage at the time of booking.

Housebound patients will be contacted by the practice in due course.

These are appointment only clinics. Appointments will be available to book from 1 September 2021. Please contact the number below, book online or ask at Reception.

THINK AGAIN— THE WINTHORPE RESIDENTS' A46 CONSULTATION GROUP / NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Great progress continues since last month's update. A dedicated village web site to allow for quick dissemination of information to the village is imminent. The Thomas Brewer Charity in the village has been approached to provide funding support for communication and information costs and we await confirmation. A dedicated bank account has also been opened. The environmental subgroup has been formed and is in conversation with Nottinghamshire County Council's environmental team and various national and local groups.

We held a very positive virtual meeting with our local MP, Robert Jenrick and he facilitated a discussion with senior Highways England officers and colleagues from Nottinghamshire County Council and Newark and Sherwood District Council both on the Option 3 proposal and the next steps in the planning process for the road proposals. One action from that meeting was that the engineering subgroup were asked to a detailed discussion with HE and their design team on Option 3. The mutual understanding on the key issues and appreciation of the villages concerns was very positive. We understand that HE will announce its preferred route later in the summer and then begin a further process of statutory consultation to get people's views.

Meetings with the village have been set in the Community Centre to discuss further progress with Option 3 and to hear your views. These meetings have been organised for **September 7**th,**7 to 9 pm and September 14**th, **10 am to 12 noon**. Please put these dates in your diary.

We will be sharing the meeting with colleagues from the Parish Council who will also be launching the future for our Neighbourhood Plan. This Plan is an important and powerful tool which will provide our community with future statutory powers to shape how the Parish of Winthorpe with Langford develops. **Neighbourhood Plan**

So, what is a Neighbourhood Plan and what does it mean for us? In very simple terms, a neighbourhood plan is:

- A document that sets out planning policies for the neighbourhood area,

The meetings promise to be very interesting so please come along and understand what the Neighbourhood Plan means for you and your neighbours and hear the latest on the A46 proposals. It's also your chance, at this early stage, to have your say and maybe get involved.

AUGUST'S RECIPE -STAYCATION OR VACATION?-



Thank you Jane for sending in this month's recipe!

"Juicy watermelon, rich olives and salty feta....the fresh, summery ingredients in this salad are simply delightful together. Enjoy this as a barbecue side dish or package it up for a picnic." - Jane C





Serves 4

Ingredients:

½ red onion, thinly sliced

1/2 watermelon

1 cucumber

20 pitted Kalamata olives, torn in half

100g feta, crumbled

4 tbsp extra virgin olive oil

4 tsp red wine vinegar

5 mint leaves, finely shredded

1/4 tsp dried oregano

WATERMELON GREEK FETA SALAD

- 1. Put the sliced onion in a bowl of cold water and leave to soak while you prepare the remaining ingredients. Carve the watermelon lengthways into three wedges, then cut away the skin and slice into 11/2 cm-thick pieces. Halve the cucumber lengthways and scoop out the seeds with a teaspoon, then slice into half-moons about ½ cm thick.
- 2. Arrange the watermelon and cucumber on 4 plates, then scatter over the olives and feta. Drain the onion and add to the salad. Drizzle each plate with 1 tbsp oil and 1 tsp vinegar; season. Serve immediately, sprinkled with the mint and oregano.


Tip:

Soaking raw onion in cold water helps to tone down its pungency before it is added to a salad.

THE PPG @ COLLINGHAM MEDICAL CENTRE UPDATE

The Patient Participation Group at Collingham Medical Centre continues with virtual meetings but of course is unable to get out and about into the community with meeting and activities at present. We are continuing with poster campaigns so keep an eye on the local notice boards for information. However here is the Practice Report from CMC to keep you informed.

- Covid cases of the Delta Variant are not in Nottinghamshire. Completing
 your full course of two COVID vaccines is your best protection against all
 variants and to stop new variants mutating. Continue to be vigilant, a
 new cough means PCR test and household to isolate until result returns,
 COVID test appointments can be sought same day & results are much
 quicker usually 24-48 hrs after test.
- All adult cohorts now open encourage your family members to uptake the vaccine to help stop it mutate in UK. The majority of those hospitalisations and COVID deaths are largely non-vaccinated individuals.
- Flu Clinics are scheduled <u>18 September</u> & <u>23 October</u> and, if stocks are announced and released for 3rd COVID, we'll do the Covid vaccination at the same time.
- Carers' Register we do actively seek information about Carer status, whether you have a carer or 'are a carer'. We collect information at the time of a patient registering and we have been updating our information during COVID for our patients who have been accessing services and are known to have a carer. This information means that carers and cared for are eligible for flu vaccines. We're not sure we've captured everyone who may care for someone. There is a carer support pack and PPG agreed that we can prepare a poster for sharing on notice boards.
- As **Shielding** is no longer active or a requirement, we are changing the way we support those members of the community who wish to continue to shield allot the first appointment of the day in each of our clinical rooms, meaning there is unlikely to be a wait to go in; they are the first patient in a deep cleaned room.
- **Call backs** for routine follow-ups will be given a 2 hr window to receive the call back, i.e. where a patient says they would prefer a call, on Thursday, we would give 2 hr window where the clinician will try to call back during that time. Offering choice to patients on mode of support, call, text or F2F.
- **Electronic Repeat Dispensing** during Medication Reviews we will start to consider for authorising medications for 12 months.
- Glossary of Terms one of the admin team is pulling this together for online users and when writing to patients with extracts of their medical records copied.
- Walking for non-walkers Group sharing poster information on our virtual board
- **New staff** Respiratory Nurse Sarah now in post and practice being supported over coming months by Emma Gowlett, Phlebotomist, and Elena Caraman, Clinical Practitioner, who are experienced hospital and out of hours healthcare team members.
- Whilst we have said goodbye to Dr Jatin Shah in June, our new GPs join us in September Dr Kate Rees & Dr Edda Scheurch

On Thursday 15th July 2021, the Parish Council held its quarterly finance meeting followed by the monthly Parish Council meeting at the Lord Nelson.

The Finance Chairman confirmed that the year-end accounts had been completed and the accounts are available for viewing. Details are on the various village notice boards.

The main Parish Council meeting discussed the use of the speed gun and how effective it had appeared to have been in deterring speeding in the village. It will be used again in July and August and any volunteers are welcome to learn how to use the gun.

The Parish Council aims to hold meetings in early September at the Community Centre to inform the village of the progress being made towards creating a Neighbourhood Plan for the village. Details of dates are **September 7th,7 to 9 pm and September 14th, 10 am to 12 noon.**

At the same meetings, an update will be provided by the "Think Again" group following their discussions with Highways England and other interested bodies in regards to the various proposals for the A46 around Winthorpe.

The Parish Council have also provided details on the village website of the proposals by Nottinghamshire County Council to place double yellow lines at the junction of Thoroughfare Lane and Gainsborough Road to prevent parking on this junction. You have the opportunity to comment on those proposals.

The Parish Council doesn't meet in August so I wish all residents of Holme, Langford and Winthorpe a pleasant summer holiday but, as always, if you have any issues please contact me via email.

- August News 2021







The cold and wet spring seems a long time ago now that we are basking in a heat wave and summer is definitely here. It's usually a quieter time of year on site, but we have still had some good birds recently to keep us all entertained.

There have been plenty of waders on Phase 3, viewable from the southern boundary public footpath, as the first of the autumn migrants start to come through. Several flocks of black-tailed godwits have been through in the last week, the largest flock of 31 coming through on the 18th. There has also been redshank, greenshank, dunlin, ringed plover, ruff, avocet, curlew, common sandpiper, green sandpiper and a flyover whimbrel in the last month.

2 red-crested pochard have been on Phase 3 recently along with two unseasonable birds – a wigeon and a goldeneye, usually winter visitors to Langford. A garganey was also seen on the 19th July. Caspian gull and yellow-legged gulls have also returned to the site, with a peak count of 15 yellow-legged gulls on the 16th July. The common terns are also doing well on the new raft, kindly funded by Nottinghamshire Birdwatchers. There are currently six well grown young on the raft that look like they are due to fledge soon. We are thrilled that the raft has been so successful in it's first year and thanks again to Nottinghamshire Birdwatchers.

The long-staying great white egrets have been showing well too recently, with a confirmed two on site. They have been roosting in the silt lagoons along with some little egrets. And speaking of heron species, the bittern has also been seen several times over the last month flying around the visitor trails. There has been a marsh harrier seen over Phase 2 looking from the viewing platform on the Cromwell Trail and hobbys have been seen catching dragonflies mid-air.


Our volunteers have been busy as ever too, still re-covering the boardwalk in new chicken wire – we are now about half way through this task! We have also been removing ragwort from our hay cut area around the visitor trails. We have to do this as ragwort is poisonous to cattle and horses, that will eat the hay that we make.

Hello from St Giles Church Holme,

We're delighted to let you know that the church will be open again when possible, from mid-August as before during the day. Further to the relaxations that came in on July 19th, there will be little change at the church as we want to see what happens before we go back to normal. Therefore, masks will still be worn at services, and soft singing will only be permitted whilst wearing a mask except for the music leaders who will be socially separated and at the front.

Keeping the churchyard mown and tidy (at no cost the village or the church) is quite a challenge for us as we get older, so it's been quite disheartening to receive complaints about the tending of the grass verge recently and difficulty in being able to park. We sincerely apologise for trying to follow the council guidelines to leave the flowers and grasses for the wildlife, and we will try and cut the growth immediately by the roadside which we have to do using hand tools as the slope and fast-moving traffic is too dangerous for our little mower. We've just maintained the path leading up to the church with new pea gravel so hopefully this will be appreciated.
