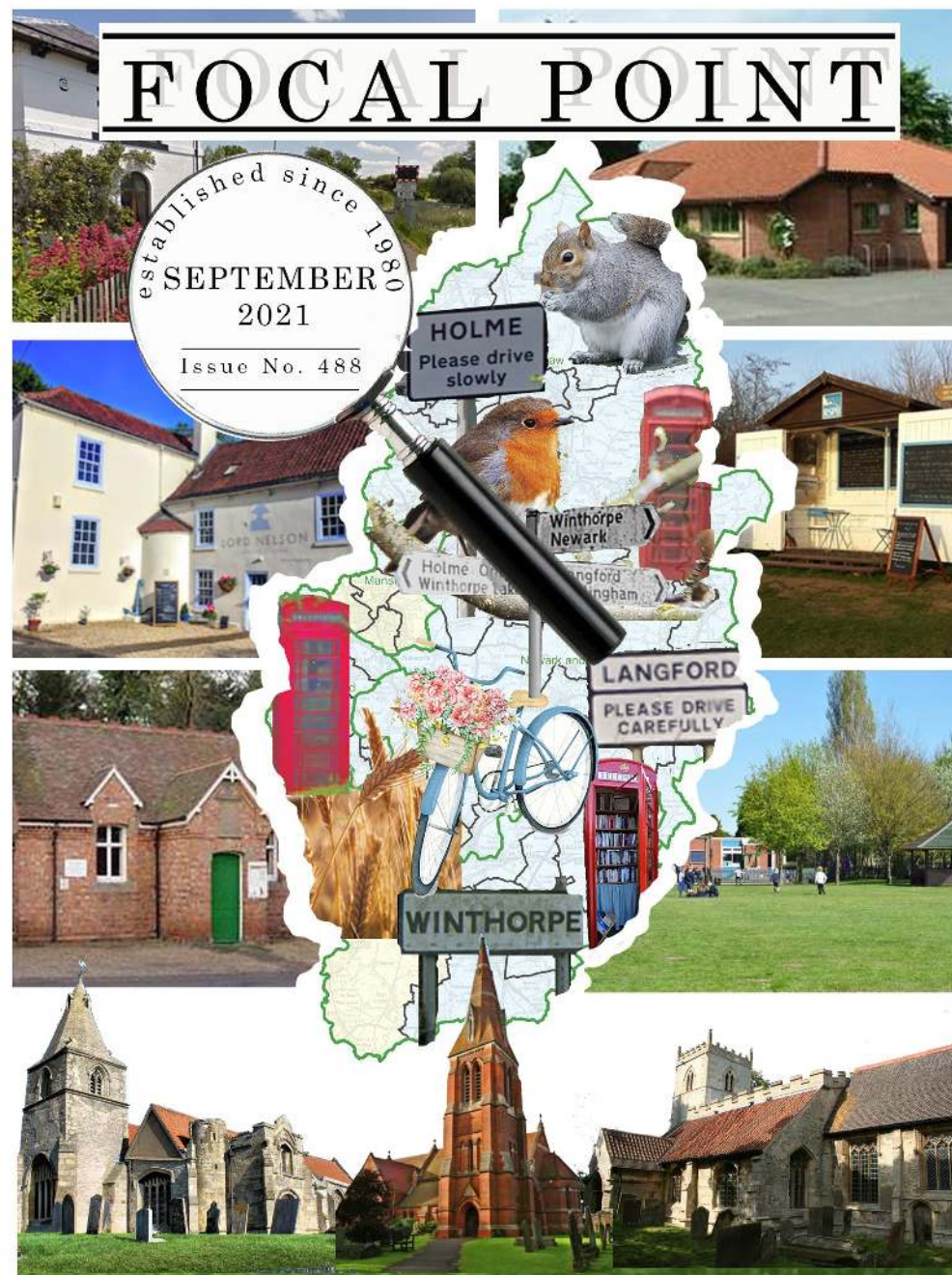

Seasonal Flu Vaccination Campaign 2021

We will be holding 2 Saturday morning flu clinics on

Saturday 18 September 2021, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm
Saturday 23 October 2021, from 8.00 am – 12.30 pm

We are aiming to vaccinate 100% of eligible patients this year, as defined by NHS guidelines. We may be able to open our offer beyond those eligible after 31 October 2021 (dependent on stocks/uptake).

Saturday clinics will focus on patients who are able to walk and stand unaided for up to 20 minutes. No seating available. Flu Vaccinations (and possibly 3rd COVID vaccine once details are confirmed) will be administered with patients stood up and a strict one-way system through the Practice will be in operation. We will continue to wear face coverings to protect your healthcare setting.

For patients with mobility issues we will be holding weekday flu clinics. Our PCAs will triage at the time of booking.

Housebound patients will be contacted by the practice in due course.

These are appointment only clinics. Appointments will be available to book from 1 September 2021. Please contact the number below, book online or ask at Reception.

THINK AGAIN— THE WINTHORPE RESIDENTS' A46 CONSULTATION GROUP AND NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Progress continues on the proposal to develop a dedicated web site, and the Thomas Brewer Charity in the village has agreed to support some communication and information costs to keep the village informed of developments.

There has been no further news from Highways England, however we understand that HE is still intending to announce its preferred route in the autumn and then begin a further process of statutory consultation to get people's views.

Opportunity was taken last week to further lobby our MP, Robert Jenrick, who was on a visit to Winthorpe, to press our case with HE for Option 3.

As already notified, meetings with the village have been set in the Community Centre to discuss further progress with Option 3 and to hear your views. These meetings have been organised for **September 7th, 7 to 9 pm and September 14th, 10am to 12 noon**. Please put these dates in your diary.

We will be sharing the meeting with colleagues from the Parish Council who will also be launching the future for our Neighbourhood Plan. This Plan is an important and powerful tool which will provide our community with future statutory powers to shape how the Parish of Winthorpe with Langford develops.

The meetings promise to be very interesting so please come along and understand what the Neighbourhood Plan means for you and your neighbours and hear the latest on the A46 proposals. It's also your chance, at this early stage, to have your say and maybe get involved.

SEPTEMBER'S RECIPE -THE START OF AUTUMN-



Thank you Jane for sending in this month's recipe!

"These fabulous brownies are dense and fudgy, thanks to the chia seeds, and rich, but not sickeningly so. They have a salted caramel-like flavour that comes from using white miso and salt together. These are incredibly special brownies and are my son, Jake's, absolute favourite chocolate treat." - Jane C

SALTED MISO BROWNIES



Makes 16 pieces

Ingredients:

4½ tbsp milled chia seeds
150g (flavourless) coconut oil
250g dark chocolate (85%),
broken into small pieces
420g light brown muscovado
sugar
120g plain flour
3½ tbsp white miso (shiro miso)
1 tsp flaky sea salt

Heat the oven to 190°C/180°C fan/gas mark 6 and line a 20cm x 22cm square tin with greaseproof paper. In a small bowl, mix the milled chia seeds with 270ml water and set aside.

Put the coconut oil and broken chocolate into a medium-sized saucepan and set over a low heat. Stir occasionally until melted, then mix in the sugar, flour and miso and crumble in the salt flakes. Finally, stir in the soaked and bloomed chia seeds, then pour into the lined tin and gently shake to distribute evenly.

Bake on the middle shelf of the oven for 45 minutes, then remove. The brownies might still be a bit wobbly in the middle, but they will soon settle down as they cool and be deliciously fudgy. Leave to cool completely, then cut into 16 squares.

Tip:

I often substitute some of the dark chocolate with a flavoured dark chocolate; ones with liquorice or raspberries are particular favourites

FUNDRAISING FOR THE LONDON MARATHON

Andrew Smith (son to Maureen and Colin of Gainsborough Road in Winthorpe) is taking Reach Learning Disability's place in the Virgin Money London Marathon on 3rd October this year. Reach receives just one place every 5 years in this prestigious event.

Andrew grew up in Winthorpe village and is keen to support Reach, based in Nottinghamshire. Money raised from Andrew's epic challenge is being doubled, thanks to a generous pledger in support of Reach's plans to build accommodation in Southwell for people with learning disabilities.

Andrew previously took on the Newark Half Marathon for Reach in 2019. He decided to push himself even further and is training hard to complete his toughest challenge to date – the iconic London Marathon, measuring 26.2 miles long. Not only that, he has set himself a goal of a target of raising £2,000 in support of his efforts. Andrew now lives in Oswestry in Shropshire with his support team consisting of his much loved Labrador Travis who often accompanies him on his short training runs and his girlfriend Lyndsey who rides alongside Andrew during some of his longer runs, offering words of encouragement.

Andrew said 'I was very excited and nervous at the same time when I was offered the marathon place. I have a big fundraising target to try and reach, but I will do my best and am really excited to be taking part in such a great event. The training is tough, but I think consistency is the key'.

Winthorpe - the Nottinghamshire village worst served by the public rights of way network

Winthorpe and adjacent parts of Newark are very poorly served by public rights of way. Not counting Winthorpe FP2 which can't be used because of the dangerous A46 crossing, the only legally available public right of way is the footpath to Holme. One thing the Lockdowns have done is prove the value of a good right of way network that people can access from home.

Newark brideway 6, shown below, is the end of a riverside route that follows the Trent right through to Farndon. Without public access across Winthorpe Rack BW6 is a dead-end stopping just short of the A1 Bridge over the Trent. With the widening of the A46 it is very important to get this gap in the riverside rights of way registered with the County Council.



Notts Ramblers needs your help with the user claim

We have to show that a **specific route across the field** has been **used by the public as of right for 20 years with no let or hindrance**.

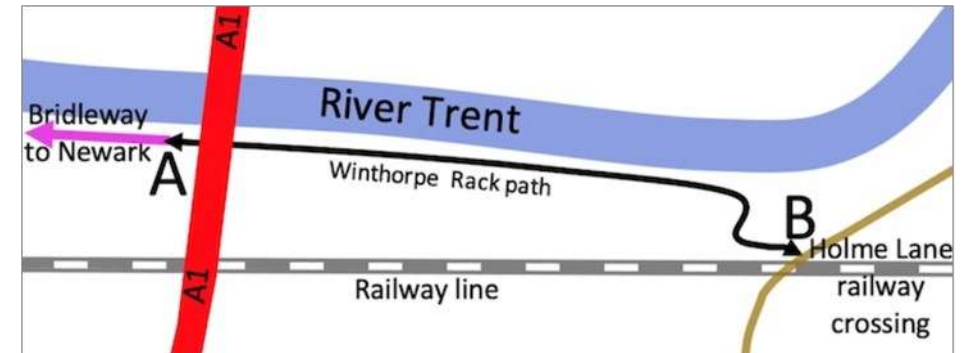
Specific route means the worn track from the gate on the Newark side of the A1, under the bridge, across the field and out along the roadway to the gap.

As of right means no signs up forbidding public use or the landowner/tenant giving permission.

Without let means no gaps in the public's use, it has to be a full continuous 20 years, but it can be any 20 years.

Hindrance means no locked gates or fences across the route.

RIGHTS OF WAY CAMPAIGN CONTINUED....



We need the public to complete a user evidence statement detailing their use of the route. Individuals don't need to have used the route for the full 20 years, just the public as a whole.

It is very interesting to view the shape of the river and the relative positioning of the church and of course how it would have connected to North Muskham pre 1599. It was at this time that the Trent changed its course and divided the two villages. It has to be remembered that Holme church was originally built as a daughter church to St Wilfred's at Muskham. We are also keen to get some detailed shots of the stone carvings high on the tower below the broach and elsewhere on the building.

On Wednesday 1st September people have shown a lot of interest in attending the Collingham & District Local History Society summer outing to Holme Church. It is quite surprising how many local people have never managed to get inside, so this will provide them with a great opportunity to make quite a discovery.

Our next service will be on Sunday 5th September and on Sunday October 17th it will be the Harvest Festival at 6pm.

Our thoughts and prayers are with anyone who is ill or hospitalised at this time.

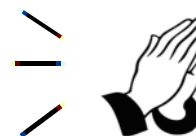
