





## **NEWARK FOODBANK**



The Foodbank distribution centre has moved. It now operates from 21 Cartergate Newark and is part of Newark Community Support. Hopefully this will help the Foodbank develop new ways of providing for the needs of people referred to them, including an in house supermarket where Foodbank vouchers can be used. Also being more central, the Foodbank will be more accessible.

The contributions our villages collect are needed more than ever. We were able to donate **54.9kg** in November and a fantastic **92.2kg** in December. Thank you so much. However, since the new year, donations at our collection points are down. I know we will all have to brace ourselves for soaring prices and inflation, but please remember that this hits the most vulnerable hardest, often pushing people from just about managing to falling in real poverty. This should not be happening in this country in 2022.

If you feel able to donate food or toiletries, the collection points in Winthorpe remain the same:

The basket in the shop area at the Lord Nelson pub during opening hours.

The black swing bin at the side of my front door, 11 Gainsborough Road, Winthorpe at any time at all. The bin is checked every day.

Winthorpe church porch. At the moment the church is open 10-12noon on Sundays when there is a service taking place, and most Thursdays, 1.30-3.30pm.

Please note that the Foodbank is unable to accept out of date items, fresh food or anything containing alcohol.

As Focal Point goes to press, National Highways (NH) have announced their preferred route on Thursday 24th. February. The information will be uploaded to the NH website, and it is expected that the households who received postal communication last time will again receive an information pack. We understand that physical copies will be sent to the Lord Nelson at Winthorpe for people to view (available from Thursday 24th) for those who are unable to access the material online. Also it has been confirmed that NH representatives will be in the Lord Nelson car park between 9 am and 1pm on Thursday 3rd March. A village meeting has been organised at Winthorpe's Community Centre between 2pm and 4pm on Friday 11th March where we will discuss the implications of the route for the village. Please put this date in your diary.

## WINTHORPE WITH LANGFORD PARISH COUNCIL

On Thursday 24th February 2022, the Parish Council held its monthly Parish Council meeting in the village hall.

The meeting was attended by a large number of village residents who wanted to raise the issue of the amended planning application at Winthorpe House. There was a strong feeling that this should be objected to for a number of reasons. The Council discussed this at length and decided to support the objections and is to write to NSDC Planning Department accordingly.

The Council also discussed the announcement from National Highways over their proposed route for the A46 around Newark. National Highways are proposing Option 2 "modified" which is fundamentally their original Option 2 but with changes to the road structure around Winthorpe. Further details can be found on the National Highways website.

Villagers will have the opportunity to discuss this with National Highways representatives at a meeting in the Lord Nelson on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm.

The Parish Council is looking for someone to take over the auditing of its accounts, and those of Focal Point following the decision by Duncan Richardson to step down from this role.

The Council would like to thank Duncan for his many years of service in this role. If anyone is interested in taking over this role, please contact me. You do not need to be a qualified auditor but only to have a financial background.

## MARCH'S RECIPE -PANCAKE DAY-



Thank you Jane for sending in this month's recipe!

"And another season begins. 1st March is Shrove Tuesday (or Pancake Day) and was traditionally about using up all the rich ingredients in the larder before the start of Lent and fasting. For a change, how about making these light and fluffy ricotta pancakes; they are a delicious treat. Serve them with fresh blueberries. toasted coconut flakes and a drizzle of maple syrup." - Jane C





Prep: about 30 minutes Cook: 10 -30 minutes Makes 8

### Ingredients:

300g ricotta

4 free-range eggs, separated

175ml coconut milk

100g/31/2oz plain flour

25g/1oz fine polenta

1 tsp baking powder

a dash of oil

a knob of butter

### To serve:

150g fresh blueberries

4 tbsp maple syrup

WE NEED

4 tbsp toasted coconut flakes



Mix the ricotta, egg yolks, coconut milk, flour, polenta and baking powder together in a bowl to make a smooth pancake batter.

Whisk the egg whites until stiff peaks form when the whisk is removed from the bowl. Fold the egg whites gently through the ricotta mixture.

Heat the oil and butter in a non-stick frying pan over a medium heat and add heaped tablespoons of the mixture, allowing room for spread. Cook for a few minutes on each side, until nicely golden brown and cooked through. Keep the cooked pancakes warm while you use up the remaining mixture.

To serve, cook the blueberries with 2 tablespoons of maple syrup in the frying pan over a low heat for 4 to 5 minutes, until the blueberries have softened and glazed in the maple syrup.

Serve the pancakes with the softened blueberries, toasted coconut flakes and the remaining maple syrup.





Dear Friends,

As spring unfurls I hope we all take time to enjoy the flowers, especially in our churchyards which are real treasure houses of different species – how many can you spot?

Spring heralds Easter, so why not take some time to think about what Easter is about beyond chocolate eggs, delicious as they are!

Here are some things for you to join in:

We have our regular church services in Winthorpe, Holme and Langford and it will be lovely to see you there. Remember that churches are made up of people, so why not start getting more involved?

Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> March is Ash Wednesday, when Lent begins. Come along to our service at St John's Collingham at 7:30pm, an opportunity to think about some of the big questions of life and death and receive an ash cross on your forehead.

On Tuesday mornings at 10am we're thinking about the "Stations of the Cross" at our Communion services in Collingham parish churches. This means we think about some of the things which happened to Jesus between his trial and death.
